

St Patrick, Missionary to the Irish

John 3:1–17—1Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. 2This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, “Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him.” 3Jesus answered him, “Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God.” 4Nicodemus said to him, “How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother’s womb and be born?” 5Jesus answered, “Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. 6That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. 7Do not marvel that I said to you, ‘You must be born again.’ 8The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.”

9Nicodemus said to him, “How can these things be?” 10Jesus answered him, “Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? 11Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. 12If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? 13No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. 14And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. 16[Jesus said:] “For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. 17For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

This month on March 17th we will thank the blessed Trinity for St. Patrick, Missionary to Ireland. Patrick was born into a Christian family in Roman Britain about AD 389. The borders of the empire were fraying fast. Raiders from Ireland pillaged the coast and carried Patrick back with them as a slave. Sent to herd pigs, Patrick served six years and pondered his fate and his faith.

In his excellent book, *“How the Irish Saved Civilization,”* Thomas Cahill describes the life Patrick lived. Cahill writes, *“The work of such slave-shepherds was bitterly isolated, months at a time spent alone in the hills.”* Patrick had been raised in a Christian home, but he didn’t really believe in God. But now—hungry, lonely, frightened, and bitterly cold—Patrick began seeking out a relationship with his heavenly Father. As he wrote in his Confessions, *“I would pray constantly during the daylight hours”* and *“the love of God . . . surrounded me more and more.”* Six years after his capture, God spoke to Patrick in a dream, saying, *“Your hungers are rewarded. You are going home. Look—your ship is ready.”*

Led by this dream, he escaped his captivity and headed toward the sea. What a startling command! If he obeyed, Patrick would become a fugitive slave, constantly in danger of capture and punishment. But he did obey—and God protected him. The young slave walked nearly two hundred miles to the Irish coast. There he boarded a waiting ship and traveled back to Britain and his family. Since he had no money to pay for a voyage and would not submit to the sailors' lewd suggestions, he almost despaired. The sailors relented and let the young man cross back with them.

Patrick finally made his way to France, where he became a monk and a priest. He returned to Ireland, the land of his captivity, about 433 to set his captors free from their slavery to idolatry. As you might expect, Patrick was a different person now, and the restless young man could not settle back into his old life. Eventually, Patrick recognized that God was calling him to enter a monastery. In time, he was ordained as a priest, then as a bishop. Finally—thirty years after God had led Patrick away from Ireland—He called him back to the Emerald Isle as a missionary.

The Irish of the fifth century were a pagan, violent, and barbaric people. Human sacrifice was commonplace. Patrick understood the danger and wrote: *"I am ready to be murdered, betrayed, enslaved—whatever may come my way."* In this labor he spent the rest of his days. He preached throughout the land, founded communities, and imparted to the Irish Church of his day a true zeal for missions. In his great Confession, he wrote, *"This is how we can repay such blessings, when our lives change and we come to know God, to praise and bear witness to his great wonders before every nation under heaven."*

Cahill notes that Patrick's love for the Irish *"shines through his writings . . . He [worried] constantly for his people, not just for their spiritual but for their physical welfare."* Through Patrick, God converted thousands. Cahill writes, *"Only this former slave had the right instincts to impart to the Irish a New Story, one that made sense of all their old stories and brought them a peace they had never known before."* Because of Patrick, a warrior people *"lay down the swords of battle, flung away the knives of sacrifice, and cast away the chains of slavery."*

An ardent and orthodox confessor of the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, Patrick brought the joy of confessing the *"Three in One and One in Three"* through the length and breadth of the Island. His episcopal seat as bishop was said to be at Armagh. March 17 is generally regarded as the day of his death. Did he die singing his hymn? *"I bind unto myself the name, The strong name of the Trinity By invocation of the same, the Three in One and One in Three. Of whom all nature hath creation, Eternal Father, Spirit, Word. Praise to the Lord of my salvation; Salvation is of Christ, the Lord!"* (LSB 604:5). *I bind unto myself today The pow'r of God to hold and lead, His eye to watch, His might to stay, His ear to hearken to my need, The wisdom of my God to teach, His hand to guide, His shield to ward, The Word of God to give me speech, His heav'nly host to be my guard. Against the demon snares of sin, The vice that gives temptation force, The natural lusts that war within, The hostile foes that mar my course; Or few or many, far or nigh, In ev'ry place and in all hours, Against their fierce hostility I bind to me those holy pow'rs.* (LSB 604:3–4)

As it is with many Christian holidays, Saint Patrick's Day has lost much of its original meaning. Instead of settling for parades, cardboard leprechauns, and *"the wearing of the green,"* we ought to recover our Christian heritage, celebrate the great evangelist, and teach our kids about this Christian hero.

Let us Pray: *Faithful God, You never cease to give to Your Church those who delight to carry the Gospel to foreign lands. Receive our thanks this day for Your servant, Patrick, who carried the saving name of Jesus to Ireland and summoned its people to abandon idolatry and worship You, the only true God, the blessed Trinity. Strengthen today all missionaries, that they may fearlessly bear Your name and summon all sinners into the joy of forgiveness and the promise of resurrection through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.*

I have learned to be in His Word more as I search scriptures to find the right Bible passages to use, that my care receiver might need at a particular time, also to be in prayer more now, as each day I think about my care receiver and pray asking God to not only help her but also to help me and be with me as I do His work. I also have found that all that, I have learned during the classes that I took to become a Stephen Minister, I have put to use in my everyday life. I have learned to be more open to other peoples problems and not to be quick to judge or to speak. To listen more carefully and not to be so ready to try to fix everyone else's problem, but to let God do that. What a blessing to know that you can help someone. To watch them from the very first day that you see them until they have come full circle with their problems and have learned to get through all the tough times and to come to the time when their problems are not consuming them any longer.

It doesn't end there, there is a special bond that I have with my care receiver, and I have made a great friend. I try to keep in touch with my previous care receiver through cards and phone calls from time to time and when I hear that she is having a problem, I call to see if I can be of help.

The blessings are fantastic and I feel that God is doing more for me than I am doing for my care receiver. It is amazing. Through prayer, God has led me to be what He wants me to be.

Receiving and Giving

Scripture Reading

“But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well” (Matthew 6:33).

As we stand at the crossroads of life, God continually reaches out to us through His Word. In Jeremiah 6:16 we read, *“This is what the Lord says: ‘Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good way is, and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls.’”* Daily we are at the crossroads of life. The choice we make is our own. As Yogi Berra said, *“When you get to a fork in the road, take it.”* The road we take will have eternal consequences. Will we choose God’s way or the ways of the world? With God’s help, our answer can be like Joshua’s. *“But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the river, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord” (Joshua 24:15).*



Joshua’s choice was that he and his family would be servants and stewards of the Lord. When you reach the crossroads in life, you will hear God’s call, *“Follow Me.”* The call to serve yourself and the ways of the world will be loud and boisterous. If you don’t reject God’s call and you follow, as Jeremiah did, the ancient paths, you will turn away from your self-interests and focus on ways to serve the Lord. Your lifestyle will reflect your relationship with Him. As followers of Jesus, we acknowledge God’s ownership and love. We become stewards of what He entrusts to us. As followers of the Lord, we see others as brothers and sisters in Christ. We live with an eternal perspective.

Prayer—Dear heavenly Father, we know that Your path is filled with peace, joy, and rest. Grant us the strength to say “no” to Satan, our flesh, and the world. Amen.





