### *As We Gather "Don't Seek the Living among the Dead"*

We come to the Divine Service today because it's Easter. We come seeking God's mercy and grace because we believe the Lord Jesus is risen from the dead! Because we know the story it is hard for us to feel or experience the strange mixture of shock and surprise of the women at the moment, they first discovered the empty tomb. The women went to Jesus' tomb because He died. Where do we put people who have died? In a tomb, in the cemetery! Who are in a cemetery?---dead people! But today we celebrate the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. He died, but He is not dead any longer. He's risen! He's alive! Therefore, He's not in a tomb, among the dead. Since then, to this day, all people are invited to seek the Lord, the living Lord, not among the dead mingled with words or places of gruesome death but among the living proclaimed as the resurrected, glorious Word of Life everlasting.

Then the disciples went back to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb. And she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had lain, one at the head and one at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which



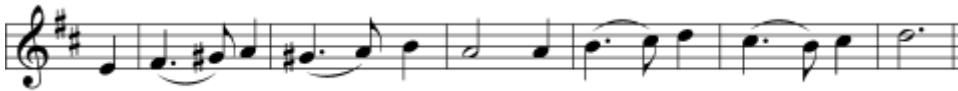

### Sermon Text—*Luke 24:1-6a*

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, “Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee...
