

Holiday Worship Schedule for 2022 "Angels- The Ultimate Divine Messengers of Hope"

On Thursday nights at 6:30pm during the month of December we will once again be having our Advent Midweek Worship Services. The theme this year is, "*Angels—The Ultimate Messengers of Hope.*" During Advent this year, we will focus on the messages brought by angels: to Zechariah, to Joseph, and to Mary. He comes in seemingly lowly, simple, and unspectacular ways that we end up discovering are full of His grace and truth. The season of Advent calls to us to stop, look, and listen for the Lord.
