Pastor's Message

Take Him at His Word!

4 When [Jesus] had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." 5 Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets." 6 When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break.....8 When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!"...10 Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." 11 So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him. (Luke 5:4-11)



The older I get, the more I realize that the power of faith in life is taking Jesus at His word and trusting what He says. Things might not work out exactly as you had imagined and you may not always see clearly what's going on at the moment. But Jesus the Christ is trustworthy and true, and you can take Him at His word. That's what's going on here in Luke 5:4-11. Jesus is in the process of gathering His disciples. He meets them in the midst of their work and challenges them to take Him at His word. Now for Peter, as well as the other fishermen, this must have been somewhat disconcerting. Think about it. Jesus was the son of a carpenter from inland Nazareth; Peter was a professional fisherman. On the water, Peter was the expert. He knew that you don't fish out in the middle of the lake. He knew that you don't fish in the middle of the day. When Jesus told him to go deep and "let down the nets for a catch," Peter must have thought, "This is crazy! It won't work." But then he says what we all need to hear today too. "Because YOU (Jesus) say so, I will let down the nets."

When it comes to the most important questions in life, the most important voice to listen to is that of Jesus. At the end of the Gospel of John, the author says it clearly: "These things are written so that you might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that while believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:31). What Jesus says about who you are, while believing in Him and His word, is really who you are. The matters He says are valuable in life are what's truly worth it. What He says you need, is, in fact, what you need. So, take Him at His word. Put your faith in Him. Entrust your life to Him. On this day, in spite of Peter's honest realization of how unworthy he is, he takes Jesus at His word and then follows Him. In time he becomes a great fisher of men, one who brings Christ's life-giving word to others in order to change their lives as well. So, remember this, no matter what is going on in your life, take Jesus at His word and entrust all things to His care.

I can't say that I'm a big Hollywood fan these days. They don't produce much that's uplifting, motivating, or meaningful. It seems like we have bigger screens and smaller movies. However, a movie I watched recently is very good, it's called, "American Underdog." It's the life story of a guy named Kurt Warner, who overcame many obstacles to become a Professional Football player in the NFL. Some of you might know him as the football guy on "Dancing with the Stars," or the CEO of a kid's foundation called, "First Things First." However, you might not know that he was a guy who overcame adversity, a guy who was never given a shot early in his career. He was a guy who was tough (in fact, sometimes to his detriment since he suffered several concussions in his career); and, yes, he did become a Super Bowl MVP, but did you know that he almost didn't make it to the pros at all? The movie tells his unlikely story. But what is even more incredible is it talks about the role of his faith in Christ in that unlikely, seemingly impossible journey.

What gave him strength to keep going amidst adversity, struggle, and days and nights when he didn't know if things were ever going to change? What was the fuel for the fire that kept him competing? What gave him power to keep his commitments to be a good father, husband, and trusted leader when no one really believed in him? That answer is his faith and trust in the God who loved him in Jesus. Listen to how Warner tells it, "If you ever really want to do a story about who I am, God's got to be at the center of it. Every time I hear a piece or read a story that doesn't have that, they're missing the whole lesson of who I am." (https://rpmministries.org/2009/01/faith-and-football/) That's faith in God's Word. Whether bagging groceries or throwing Super Bowl winning touchdown passes, God's plan was the power for his life. He learned Peter's lesson well, "Because YOU (Jesus) say so, I will let down the nets."



You may be at a very difficult place right now. You may be feeling weak and discouraged. In our lesson today, Simon Peter gets a glimpse of God's promise being fulfilled in the person and work of Jesus right before his eyes. He encounters Jesus who tells him to do something that his many years of wisdom and experience would doubt. But he does it just because Jesus is who He is. Peter does it, and Jesus not only brings success, but abundance beyond any of Peter's expectations. It reduces Peter to fear until Jesus tells him that He has plans for Peter to love others as he himself is loved, to become a fisher of men for Jesus' sake.

Whatever you are facing today, this lesson reminds us that nothing matters more than Jesus because he cares for you beyond your wildest expectations. Things may not work out as neatly as they did for Peter on that day or for Kurt Warner, but the Lord who would go to the cross for people like Peter, did so for you too. With "cross and resurrection" confidence, you can be assured of Christ's loving care for you. You can read His Scriptures as a gift from His loving heart to you, and you can take Him at His word!

PRAYER: Dear Lord Jesus, ours is a sinful, fearful world. There are days that we feel exhausted, at the end of our wits and strength. Give us Peter's wisdom to see our utter need, and give us faith like Peter to take You at Your word in all things. Amen.


Hunger Task Force - Annual Fund Drive

Lenten Devotions from Lutheran Hour Ministries



Man of Sorrows, People of Joy paints a revealing picture of Jesus as He winds His way to the cross. Using Matthew's Gospel as its source, we see Jesus as teacher, healer, comforter, and Savior. Our Shepherd's crucifixion and resurrection now make joy and true life available to His followers—to those who through faith entrust their lives to Him. Our Lord Jesus, though divine in nature, took on human form and thus became intimately acquainted with our griefs and sorrow (see Isaiah 53:1-6). That God would send His Son to bear our sins and die on our behalf is testament to God's unbounded love—a love that declares believers innocent through the Savior's triumphant resurrection.

We are offering these devotions at our Church in both a physical booklet form and we will be emailing them out to our members. This devotional will include our Lenten Worship Schedule for Grace with contact information for our Church. To view the devotions online go to: https://www.lhm.org/lent/

Consider using this devotion not only for your own personal and family devotions during the Lenten season, but also to share with your neighbor, family member, friend, or co- worker so that they too can share in the comforting Gospel of our Lord's passion and death for the forgiveness of our sins.

What is Lent? The season of Lent begins in February or March. The word *lent* has its origin in the same root as one of the German words for "spring," Lenz. As nature awakens from the death of winter, so the Christian finds newness of life in Christ, rising from sin's death. During the 40 days of Lent, God's baptized people cleanse their hearts through the discipline of Lent: repentance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Lent is a time in which God's people prepare with joy for the paschal feast (Easter). It is a time in which God renews His people's zeal in faith and life. It is a time in which we pray that we may be given the fullness of grace that belongs to the children of God.

Customs: Lent begins with Ash Wednesday when ashes are placed on the forehead to symbolize repentance. The color for this service is black or purple. The color for the rest of Lent is purple. The hymns and services of Lent do not include the joyful word, "Alleluia." Consider fasting during daylight hours. Spend your regular mealtime in prayer and devotional reading. If you cannot abstain from food for health reasons, abstain from something else (e.g., television or another leisure activity). Do not fast on Sundays, which are not part of the 40 days of Lent. Read Bible stories with children each day.





A Letter from a Stephen Minister here at Grace

Being a Stephen Minister has been such a wonderful blessing for me. To know that God is using me to help someone in need. Even though God is the one who will do the curing of whatever the problem the care receiver has, I will be His tool.

God uses us to be listeners, to be non-judgmental, to have great care in our hearts, to keep things confidential, to help the care receiver to come to her own conclusions to their problems and to be there for them whenever they need us. To walk beside them as they go through their problems.

Not only is God using me to help someone else who is in need, but He has blessed me with so much more. I have learned to be in His Word more as I search scriptures to find the right Bible passages to use that my care receiver might need at a particular time, also to be in prayer more now. Daily I think about my care receiver and pray to God to not only help her but also to help me and be with me as I do His work. I also have found that I have learned so much during the classes that I took to become a Stephen Minister; I have put all of this knowledge to use in my everyday life. I have learned to be more open to other people's problems and not to be quick to judge or to speak. To listen more carefully and not to be so ready to try to fix everyone else's problems, but to let God do that. God has shown me that I can do this and anything else that He gives me to do because He is there to help me through.

What a blessing to know that you can help someone. To watch them from the very first day that you see them until they have come full circle with their problems and have learned to get through all the tough times and to come to the time when their problems are not consuming them any longer.

It doesn't end there, there is a special bond that I have with my care receiver, and I have made a great friend. I try to keep in touch with my previous care receivers through cards and phone calls and when I hear that they are having a problem, I call to see if I can be of help.

The blessings are fantastic and I feel that God is doing more for me than I am doing for my care receiver. It is AMAZING! Through prayer, God has led me to be what He wants me to be.

On our stewardship journey, we are transformed into new people who are changed by the Holy Spirit from self-centered to Christ-centered people. In Christ, we are new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17). We have been changed from selfish to generous people. We move forward in our generosity, learning to give more and more. Our journey will be marked by ups and downs, but with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue moving forward by God's grace. Our journey and transformation are only complete in our eternal home with Jesus.



Living with Purpose

We, like most people, enjoy our careers that provide an income to pay for housing, transportation, and other necessities and comforts. We love our families. We try to be good neighbors in our communities, and we make every effort to be upstanding citizens. On the surface, our lives in many ways resemble non-Christians. However, as believers, we live with the awareness that God gives us a purpose that is much more meaningful than having successful careers, being good neighbors, or patriotic citizens.

Through faith, we understand the special purpose that God gives us is to be participants in His mission "to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10). The Apostle Paul wrote, God "desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). We are His vessels through whom He works. We become His hands, feet, and mouth to share the life-saving Gospel to the world.



Jesus spelled out our purpose: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you will be My witnesses to the end of the earth" (Acts 1:8). Speaking to His disciples, Jesus said, "As the Father has sent Me, even so I am sending you." (John 20:21). The Holy Spirit provides the strength and motivation that we need as we are being sent to witness to others. Paul tells us that we have been reconciled with God through Christ (2 Corinthians 5:16-21) and have been given the ministry of helping others to come to know that peace with God. "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of His own possession," wrote Peter, "that you may proclaim the excellences of Him Who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9). In what is referred to as the Great Commission, Jesus said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20). These verses put an exclamation point in the purpose that God has for our lives. Early in the Gospels, Jesus calls His disciples, and He tells them that they will be fishers of men. The role of the disciples has now passed to us.

God's Word challenges us to use our time, talents, and money, so we can make an eternal difference in the lives of others. Because God is always with us, we can be faithful in our purpose to be God's participants in His mission to save all people. May we hear our Lord say, "Well done, good and faithful servant."

All These Things

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. MATTHEW 6:33

When God came to Solomon in a dream and asked him what he wanted, Solomon could have asked for riches, or wealth, or honor, or the life of his enemies, or long life for himself (II Chronicles 1:7-11). 
