Pastor's Message

The Festival of Pentecost

"Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord, With all Your graces now outpoured On each believer's mind and heart; Your fervent love to them impart. Lord, by the brightness of Your light In holy faith Your Church unite; From ev'ry land and ev'ry tongue This to Your praise, O Lord, our God, be sung: Alleluia, alleluia!" (LSB 497:1)

This month on May 28th the Holy Church celebrates with greatest joy the Feast of Pentecost. Make no mistake about it: it had all been for this. To pour out the Holy Spirit, Jesus first by that same Spirit had taken flesh from the holy Virgin. To pour out the Spirit, He had lived that life of love, suffered and died, descended to hell, and rose in victory on the third day. To pour out the Holy Spirit, Jesus had ascended into heaven and was seated at the right hand of the Father. It was this day, fifty days after Christ rose from the dead, that He kept His promise. Jesus poured out His Spirit, and the Spirit rushed into human history like never before. He came with a startling suddenness that was impossible to miss.

He came that morning in wind and flame and the miracle of the apostles proclaiming God's mighty works in languages they'd never learned. But as Peter preached, he invited the people not to wait around for a similar miracle. Rather, he pointed them to where they (and every generation since) may receive the Holy Spirit no less powerfully than the apostles had: "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to Himself." (Acts 2:38-39)

No less than three thousand people took the plunge that day. Adults and children got into the baptismal water. There they received the exact same Spirit that had fallen on the disciples earlier. "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." And He came bringing joy abounding.

Your Baptism is not only your personal Easter, joining you to Christ's death and resurrection; it is also your personal Pentecost. Baptism is where Peter tells you to go to receive in Jesus' name forgiveness for all your sins and a share in the promised Spirit. And how we need the Holy Spirit! We cannot by our own reason or strength believe in Christ or even come to Him. Faith is always the work and gift of the Holy Spirit. St. Paul declares in 1 Corinthians 2:12: "Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might understand the things freely given us by God." So, we constantly pray with the Church, "Come, Holy Spirit!"

Prayer: O God, on the day of Pentecost You once taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending them the light of Your Holy Spirit. Grant us in our day by the same Spirit to have a right understanding in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy consolation; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.





Being Available for Service

In every church, there are people who continually rise to the occasion to get the work done. Although God calls each of us to follow and serve Him, many of us are much more



concerned about our own lives and goals than assisting in the Lord's work. If we focus on "I, me, mine, and myself," we take care of "number one" to the exclusion of helping and serving. In our prayers, we should be asking God to grant us hearts that we want to serve, and we should be asking Him, "what do You want to achieve through me today?"

Faithful Giving Pleases God

A young boy wanted to give a gift to his mom for Mother's Day. He didn't know what to give. He didn't have any money, so he was struggling and searching for ideas. On Mother's Day, he gave his mom a card, and, in the card, he stuck two of his favorite toy soldiers. What a happy mom, because she saw how much her son loved her by his willingness to give up his favorite toys. She didn't need the gift, but she loved receiving it.

God doesn't need our gifts, but He loves receiving them. Through our gifts, we express our love and gratitude. Through faith, we hold on to possessions loosely knowing all that we are and have are by God's grace. We own nothing. Through the working of the Holy Spirit, God fills our hearts with a spirit of generosity. We stop seeing the money we have as just for our needs and entertainment. By grace, we understand that the money God entrusts to us has the potential to be used to support mission starts and missionaries, so they can share the life-saving Gospel in this land and overseas. Our money has the potential to help those who are hungry and homeless. It has the potential to support our Christian schools and agencies. It supports the mission and ministry of our church. God uses and multiplies the money we give in many wonderful ways.

Through God-given faith and new attitudes, we see that our generosity is made possible by and rooted in His generosity. We are empowered to give because of God's generosity to us. Knowing that He doesn't limit His gifts to us and experiencing His generosity at work in our lives, we respond to His appeal to give generously. God's people live with an abundant perspective trusting in His provisions. In Scripture, we see repeatedly how God's people demonstrated their trust in His abundance. Abel, Noah, Abraham, Jacob, David, the Poor Widow, Zacchaeus, and Barnabas demonstrated



their faith and trust. In 2 Corinthians chapters 8 and 9, the Apostle Paul instructs the Corinthians to take up a collection for the Christian Jews suffering from famine in Jerusalem. Paul urges them to give generously because their generosity is rooted in God's ability to provide everything they need to be generous on all occasions. "And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8). As our bounteous God richly bestowed on the Corinthians the capacity for generosity, He can do the same for us. In Jesus it is always more and never less. Even when things are tough, we will be given the opportunity to share because God's sufficiency will provide.

When we give generously from loving and cheerful hearts, we bring joy to our Heavenly Father because we display His image and likeness. Filled with God's sufficiency, rather than our own, we become generous givers.

DEVOTIONAL

The Deeper Things

For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart.

1 Samuel 16:7

A compliment is a genuine expression of praise or admiration, a simple act of thoughtfulness that can brighten any day. Flattery, on the other hand, is insincere and often excessive praise. It's easy for most of us to spot a flatterer because there's always something in it for them, for example, an employee telling his boss how great his new haircut looks when he knows full well his hair looks like it's been chopped with a weed whacker.



In contrast to insincere compliments, the apostle Paul's compliments to his fellow workers in Christ were of a spiritual nature, and completely selfless. In his letter to the Roman church (Romans 16:1-15), Paul begins by introducing Phoebe as a dear Christian woman who "has also been a helper of many" (verse 2 NASB). He follows with a long list of compliments for others: "Give my greetings to Tryphaena and Tryphosa, the Lord's workers, and to dear Persis, who has worked so hard for the Lord. Greet Rufus, who the Lord picked out to be his very own" (verses 12-13NLT). Paul's compliments likely encouraged and bolstered the confidence of those in the ministry with him and helped them to be better in the work God had called each of them to do.

FAITH CHECK

Instead of complimenting people on the way they look outside, why not take a cue from the apostle Paul and compliment them on their inner beauty?


