Pastor's Message

"God's Word: You Can Trust It"

"10 As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, 11 so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it. 12 You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and hills will burst into song before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands." (Isaiah 55:10-12)

There are a lot of words being thrown around today. It seems like everyone is talking, but very few people are making real sense. On top of that, very few people are speaking words that really do bless us. Most words today aim to divide and conquer. Most words today are used to grab or grant power, rather than to direct and bless. The movements in our country which concern me the most are those which are intolerant of God's moral word in Holy Scripture. For without hearing God's Word which brings us to repentance, one can't even comprehend the need for God's good news of life and salvation in Christ alone as a gift. Words matter, but the Bible is the only Word from God that can save and give life.

Thank God we still hear God's Word today. It gives us direction. It defines ethical and moral boundaries. It disciplines, rebukes, and corrects. It judges, forgives, empowers, and blesses. God's Word still holds. Even more wonderfully, God's Word of promise holds us. And that's especially good news today because we live in a society that is confused, a culture whose answers to its perceived problems merely cause more confusion and destruction. Who would have imagined that sexual libertinism, which used to be thought of as an immoral or at least an amoral way of life, is now not merely tolerated, but put forth to be celebrated and embraced? Intact families and monogamous relationships which pledge "till death do us part" are ridiculed. Children are put at risk. Families don't even try to stay together. Loneliness and despair are on the rise. In all of this, we are falsely advised to find comfort in our own selves, our own words, and our own wisdom outside the foundation from God's enduring Word.

That's why I laugh a bit inside when people ask me, Pastor Taggatz, do you think that the message of the Bible is still relevant today?" It's not only relevant. It's necessary. We need God's Word like never before. Of course, I'm not referring to some watered-down type of word manipulated to pander to cultural whims, but a concrete word from God that has the power to bring life and salvation where there is only despair, death, and destruction. We need a message from God that comes all the way to us because we can never find our way back to God. We need His Word because it brings real joy, peace, and change amidst all of the noise of useless words that distract us from a meaningful relationship with God and with each other.

God's Word in the Bible gives us God's "No" and God's "Yes," God's Word of Law & Gospel, not a message of "tolerance of sin," No, a message of redemption and reconciliation! His Word gives life and makes life worth living now and forever. His is the only Word powerful enough both to condemn justly and to create faith graciously, to judge and to save. The Apostle Peter reminds us that there is no other name under heaven given among all of humanity by which we might be saved (Acts 4:12). The name? The "Word made flesh," Jesus the Christ (John 1:14). Amidst all the challenges of today, get back to God's Word! It holds and it upholds you like it always has and always will.

Prayer: Dear Lord Jesus, give me confidence in Your Word in all things, especially now. Amen.



When we sow generously, we will reap generously (2 Corinthians 9:6) Jesus said, "For with measure you use, it will be measured back to you." (Luke 6:38) When we honor God with our tithes and offerings, God said that He will "pour down for [us] a blessing until there is no more need" (Malachi 3:10). Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35)

"Crown Him Lord of All"

One of the greatest hymns of the Church is "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name," and each stanza of that hymn ends with the refrain: "Crown Him Lord of All." What a joy it is to sing, "All hail the power of Jesus' name..." Jesus, Who has secured our forgiveness and salvation, deserves to be crowned Lord of all. Someone has correctly pointed out that, unless we crown Christ "Lord of all," we can't crown Him Lord at all.

But, because of our sinful nature, we refuse to crown Jesus Lord of all. Instead, we believe that we are the ones who deserve to wear the crown. Most of us have heard the phrase "We have met the enemy, and he is us." We live in opposition against God, and we have this inborn desire to do things our way and for ourselves. We are the king and master of our lives. G.K. Chesterton wrote, "Of all horrible religions the most horrible is the worship of God within." The Holy Spirit's on-going work is to rescue us from ourselves. Through the help of the Holy Spirit, we see how foolish and wrong it is to make ourselves the god of our lives, and we are led to repentance.

In speaking to His disciples and now to us, Jesus said, "If anyone would come after Me let him deny himself and take up his cross" (Matthew 16:24). Denying ourselves is an essential part of crowning Jesus Lord of all. The Pocket Bible Dictionary defines self-denial as, "Voluntary limitation of one's desires, a requirement of Jesus of His followers. Paul also urged Christians to make an offering of themselves to God (Romans 12:1)." As followers of Jesus, we are called to reject our natural inclination to follow our will rather than God's. With God's help, we can overcome the persistent demands from our carnal selves and bring them into submission to God's Word. In the words of Paul, "And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires" (Galatians 5:24). Only by God's grace and the power of the Holy Spirit can we learn to deny self.

When the Holy Spirit helps us to crown Jesus Lord of our lives, we will use our time, talents, and money in ways that honor Him. We are enabled to understand that our lives, gifts, and blessings are from God, and we express our gratitude to Him for making us part of His kingdom by using what we've been given in service to others.

We close with the final stanza of "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name."

Oh, that with yonder sacred throng

We at His feet may fall!

We'll join the everlasting song

And crown Him Lord of all.
