Pastor's Message

"In Everything Give Thanks"

*"In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."
- 1 Thessalonians 5:18*

The barracks where Corrie ten Boom and her sister, Betsy, were kept in the Nazi concentration camp Ravensbruck were terribly overcrowded and flea-infested. Corrie and Betsy had been able to miraculously smuggle a Bible into the camp, and in that Bible they had read that in all things they were to give thanks and that God can use anything for good. Betsy decided that this meant thanking God for the fleas.

This was too much for Corrie, who said she could do no such thing. Betsy insisted, so Corrie gave in and prayed to God, thanking Him even for the fleas. Over the next several months a wonderful, but curious, thing happened: They found that the guards never entered their barracks. This meant that the women were not assaulted. It also meant that they were able to do the unthinkable, which was to hold open Bible studies and prayer meetings in the heart of a Nazi concentration camp. Through this, countless numbers of women came to faith in Christ. Only at the end did they discover why the guards had left them alone and would not enter their barracks: It was because of the fleas.

This Thanksgiving, give thanks to God for every good and perfect gift (James 1:17), but also thank Him for how He will use all things for good in the lives of those who trust Him (Romans 8:28). We as Lutherans believe in the doctrine of "*sola gratia*," which means "by grace alone." This core principle underscores the understanding that our blessings, particularly our salvation, come solely through God's unmerited favor and grace He gives to us through our Savior Jesus. Our gratitude to God for the blessings in Christ Jesus is rooted in the profound realization of God's boundless love and mercy. It is through Christ that believers are reconciled with God and experience forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. As the apostle Paul writes in Ephesians 2:8-9, "*For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast.*"

Our gratitude and thankfulness should be a natural response to God's grace. It is an acknowledgment that we are saved not because of our own deeds or merits but solely because of God's love and the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. Romans 6:23 says, "*For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.*" This gift is something for which they give unending thanks. Our thanksgiving in the is not limited to words but is expressed through a life of service and love for one's neighbor. As followers of Christ, we seek to embody the teachings of Jesus, who encouraged acts of kindness, compassion, and love for others. The Apostle Paul's words in 1 Thessalonians 5:18, "*In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you,*" remind us that gratitude is an integral part of our Christian journey. Giving thanks to God for the blessings in Christ Jesus is a profound recognition of God's grace and a response to His boundless love. It is an acknowledgment that salvation is a gift freely given, which inspires a life of faith, love, and service to others. In a time of economic uncertainty, in a time when many are facing physical and emotional challenges, there can be little doubt that such a trusting prayer of gratitude will be challenging to consider. But when you feel that challenge, take a moment and remember the fleas of Ravensbruck. And thank God anyway. See you in worship!

Stephen Ministry Training at Grace

Are you interested in becoming a Stephen Minister? Stephen Ministers are lay congregation members trained to provide one-to-one care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation.

Stephen Ministers come from all walks of life, but they all share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need. Trainees learn how to listen to, care for, and walk with those going through difficult times in life. After being matched with a person experiencing a life crisis, the Stephen Minister meets with that person on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support. The caring relationship lasts as long as the need for care exists. We are going to begin a new training session for Stephen Ministers in February of 2024. The training is scheduled to take place on Sunday evenings from 6-8:30pm starting February 11th and ending June 23rd. (We will take off for Easter Monday and Memorial Day).

Adult Bible Class Topic— God's Word for Today: 1 & 2 Thessalonians—*The Lord is Faithful.* On Sunday mornings in the school building, we will be studying 1 & 2 Thessalonians from 9:15-10:15am. In this bible study you will learn that God gave Paul a vision. In it, a man from Macedonia pleaded with Paul saying, "*Come over to Macedonia and help us*" (Acts 16:9). Following the Lord's call, Paul and his entourage eventually reached Thessalonica. In his two letters addressed to the Thessalonian Christians, Paul expresses his deep care as a founding pastor concerned about his fledgling congregation. In addition to Christian persecution, the Lord's second coming, the antichrist, and Christian discipline, in this bible study you will learn about:
the power of the word of God;
the importance of living a God-pleasing life;
the reason why we are faithful to the bible's teachings.

“Giving Acceptable Gifts”

The first act of giving from a person to God in God’s Word is found in Genesis 4 when Cain and Abel gave their gifts to God. Both brothers gave gifts from their profits. Cain gave some of his crops, whereas Abel gave the firstborn of his flock and of the fat portion. *“And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering, but for Cain and his offering He had no regard”* (Genesis 4:4b-5). God viewed their gifts differently. Abel’s gift pleased God and Cain’s did not.

In the Hall of Faith chapter, Hebrews 11, we read, *“By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks”* (Hebrews 11:4). So why was Abel’s gift more acceptable than Cain’s? Abel gave a better sacrifice not because of what he brought but because of his faith that prompted his gift. His gift was acceptable because of his motive for giving. God looks at the heart of the giver. Abel loved and trusted God and gave accordingly.

We demonstrate our faithfulness through what we give. Through faith, we give acceptable gifts. Knowing Who God is and what He has done for us through Jesus, we want to thank and praise Him with gifts that are acceptable and pleasing to Him. When we give God our first and best out of thankful hearts, God is pleased to receive them.

There are gifts we can give to God that are not acceptable. When we give token amounts and only go through the motion of giving, God is not pleased. If we give to God for tax purposes, for recognition, or give only our leftovers, God is dishonored. God wants our total devotion. When He has our hearts, we will make the effort to give our first and best in gratitude for Who God is and all He has done and continues to do for us.

As sinful people, we struggle in our efforts to give acceptable gifts. Our nature is to keep rather than to give. Left to ourselves, we would limit our giving to what is leftover rather than to make giving a priority. By God’s grace, we acknowledge that He is the one Who has made it possible for us to earn an income, and He is the owner of all that we have. In essence, we are merely returning to Him what He has already given to us. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we are enabled to make giving a priority and to give generously. We seek to thank and honor Him by giving our heavenly Father acceptable gifts. God gave us the most acceptable gift of all when He sent His Son to the cross for our redemption and salvation. The Apostle Paul wrote, *“Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift”* (2 Corinthians 9:15).

May God grant us His grace to view, manage, and use our money in ways that give Him honor.



Holiday Worship Schedule for 2023

“Jesus: The Son of David, the Son of Abraham”

On Thursday nights @ 6:30pm at Grace during the last Thursday in November and the month of December we will once again be having our Advent Midweek Worship Services. There is great interest in genealogies today. In the past, such interest was usually confined to one dutiful family member who would gather all the information together and begin reconstructing the family tree. However, genealogy websites have simplified such work so that even the most casual observers are able to explore their family histories and better understand their pasts. The scientific advances of DNA are also allowing people to explore more than just one or two branches of the family tree and also to understand how all the generations of the past have come together in each unique, individual family member. In these weeks of Advent, the sermons will help us unpack the significance of Jesus’ genealogy and how God was at work weaving his plan of salvation throughout the history of his chosen people—*as he reveals in the Old Testament all the way through Joseph and Mary*.
