Pastor's Message

"Jesus: The Only Light that Shines for You!"

"When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

A blessed Advent & Christmas Season to you all. I'm so very glad that nothing in this world can ultimately prevent the message of the good news of our Savior from being proclaimed year in and year out. Jesus reminds us, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away" (Matthew 24:35). That same Jesus tells us today that He, and He alone, is the light of the world. So, we pray: Dear Jesus, shine brightly into our hearts, and into our world! Amen.

In our culture, I'm thankful that the whole Advent/Christmas time is still a time for lights, aren't you? That's one thing that hasn't been cancelled yet. People still string up their houses, bushes, and trees. They fill the neighborhood with light virtually every night from Thanksgiving to New Year's Day. My family and I especially enjoy driving around our nearby neighborhoods enjoying the lights, even going down to Candy Cane Lane in West Allis. One of my favorite pictures is when the lights are beaming with a glow, piercing even the snow cover of a winter storm. Lights shining in the darkness, lights overcoming snow cover, light's piercing through the storm—all of that shows light's power to bless.

Jesus reminds us today that He doesn't just "represent" light in our lives. He is the light of the world for all who live in the darkness of sin, death, and the devil. He shines to expose our need for Him (piercing through the world's ultimate darkness), but, more importantly, He shines to provide a way home, and to invite us home with Him. He's the light of the world, the light that overcomes the darkness and calls us home to God in Him. That's His bold claim—He is the real light of this world.

But, Jesus' claim is more than calling you to come to God. More importantly than that, He's telling you that He Himself is God coming to and for you. So many get caught up in the beautiful reality of the baby Jesus and the godly family of Mary and Joseph that they miss the mission of "the light of the world." When Jesus was presented at the temple shortly after his birth, a man named Simeon gathered baby Jesus in his arms (Luke 2:25-35). He proclaimed that Jesus is the Messiah, "a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel" (Luke 2:32). Then Simeon added these words to Mary, Jesus' mother: "34 Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed 35

(and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:34b-35).

Revealing light and saving light show us the light of the world at work in our world. Don't miss the light of Jesus this Advent & Christmas. See Him as He really is because Jesus is the only light that shines "for you" for the things that really matter, both now and forever. No political light, no relationship light, no economic light, no identity light, nor any "stature in community" light can shine like His light for your life and salvation

Natural light is a pretty amazing thing. In a time of "manufactured light," we often take natural light for granted. Natural light reveals the world to us. Body and soul crave it. Light sets our biological clocks. It triggers in our brains the sensations of color. Light feeds us, supplying the energy for plants to grow. It inspires us with special effects like rainbows and sunsets. Light gives us life-changing tools, from incandescent bulbs to lasers and fiber optics. Scientists don't fully understand what light is or what it can do. They just know that it is essential to life and that it will illuminate our future. All of that provides just a glimpse of who Jesus is for you! He declares, "I am the light of the world," and He shines forth to give you the light of eternal life.

Prayer: Dear Jesus, may this Christmas Season open up my heart to see my need for You. Then grant me faith to trust in You as the light of my life now and forever. Amen.

Stephen Ministry Training at Grace

Are you interested in becoming a Stephen Minister?

Stephen Ministers are lay congregation members trained to provide one-to-one care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation.

Stephen Ministers come from all walks of life, but they all share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need. Trainees learn how to listen to, care for, and walk with those going through difficult times in life. After being matched with a person experiencing a life crisis, the Stephen Minister meets with that person on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support. The caring relationship lasts as long as the need for care exists. We are going to begin a new training session for Stephen Ministers in February of 2024. The training is scheduled to take place on Sunday evenings from 6-8:30pm starting February 11th and ending June 23rd. (We will take off for Easter Monday and Memorial Day).

Our Grief Share grief recovery seminar and support group will meet on Monday evenings starting October 30th from 6:30-8:00pm in the school library and it will end on Monday February 12th. We will take off December 25th and January 1st. There will also be a special lesson on "Surviving the Holidays," for those grieving the death of loved ones, which will take place on Monday November 20th. The cost for attending is \$20.00. Adult Bible Class Topic— God's Word for Today: 1 & 2 Thessalonians—The Lord is Faithful. On Sunday mornings in the school building, we will be studying 1 & 2 Thessalonians from 9:15-10:15am. In this bible study you will learn that God gave Paul a vision. In it, a man from Macedonia pleaded with Paul saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us" (Acts 16:9). Following the Lord's call, Paul and his entourage eventually reached Thessalonica. In his two letters addressed to the Thessalonian Christians, Paul expresses his deep care as a founding pastor concerned about his fledgling congregation. In addition to Christian persecution, the Lord's second coming, the antichrist, and Christian discipline, in this bible study you will learn about:

- 1. The power of the word of God
- 2. The importance of living a God-pleasing life
- 3. The reason why we are faithful to the bible's teachings

If you find it difficult to remember to begin each day with a simple stewardship prayer - asking God how He wants you to share the gifts He has given you - you might want to let one of the Magi be your reminder.

The Magi - or the wise men - traveled far distances and made great sacrifices to bring gifts to Jesus. This year, before you pack away your nativity set, select one of the wise men bearing his gift for Jesus and set this statue in a place that you will see every day - maybe on your desk, your dresser or your kitchen counter. When you see this gift bearer let it be a reminder to ask Jesus what gifts He would like you to give for Him each day throughout the year.

And if someone asks why you have a Christmas decoration out, you can simply say that this little statue is reminding you to be more generous.

"Jesus: The Son of David, the Son of Abraham"

On Thursday nights @ 6:30pm at Grace during the last Thursday in November and the month of December we will once again be having our Advent Midweek Worship Services. There is great interest in genealogies today. In the past, such interest was usually confined to one dutiful family member who would gather all the information together and begin reconstructing the family tree. However, genealogy websites have simplified such work so that even the most casual observers are able to explore their family histories and better understand their pasts. The scientific advances of DNA are also allowing people to explore more than just one or two branches of the family tree and also to understand how all the generations of the past have come together in each unique, individual family member. In these weeks of Advent, the sermons will help us unpack the significance of Jesus' genealogy and how God was at work weaving his plan of salvation throughout the history of his chosen people—as he reveals in the Old Testament all the way through Joseph and Mary Here is the order of holiday worship for the coming month, we hope to see you in worship as we receive Christ's gifts of Word and Sacrament for the forgiveness of our sins, eternal life, and salvation. Ladies Wednesday Morning Bible Study

The Ladies Wednesday Morning Bible Study has started a new Bible Study on Wednesday mornings. It is entitled, "God's Provision in a Wilderness World" by Lindsay Hausch through Concordia Publishing House. In this Bible Study we will learn that for the Israelites wandering through the wilderness and us, God's manna is a gift wrapped in struggle. This example of God providing manna invites us to look at our present life—with its bittersweet beauty—and see how our Creator is blessing us with His gifts in our everyday struggles. The forty studies in this book will lead you through the Book of Exodus as the Israelites wander through the wilderness, pointing you to what God wants you to know and apply to your own life.

This women's Bible study is broken up into eight weeks, with five sessions per week, for a total of forty studies. Our culture is a wilderness where our effort to satisfy our needs with things of this world leaves our hearts empty and aching for more. Every day, no matter where you wander, God invites you to take time in His Word and recenter your heart on Him. God's provision for you is personal. He meets you where you are. And He gives you what you need.
