Pastor's Message

"Jesus is All That We Need"

"For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord." (1 Corinthians 1:26-31)

The end of the 1st chapter of Paul's letter to the people living in Corinth long ago applies especially well to our present day. Paul reminded those people who they had been without God, who they now were in Christ, and then what they were to do in this life as God's people until the day they would see their Creator and Redeemer face to face for all eternity. I thought this passage was worth looking at in this New Year, especially because of the uncertain times in which we live. What's my point? When life reduces you to virtually nothing, whether physically, emotionally, and/or spiritually, and yet you have Jesus as your Lord and Savior by faith, then He is all you need for an abundant, useful, and eternal life, both now and forever. He gives you power to face whatever comes your way each and every day.

This passage from 1st Corinthians calls us to "boast in the Lord" alone. This reminded me of the story of a Vietnamese man named Hien Pham. Christian evangelist Ravi Zacharias got to know him while working in Vietnam in 1971. Of Hien, Zacharias said, "One of my interpreters was Hien Pham, an energetic young Christian. He had worked as a translator with the American forces, and was of immense help both to them and to missionaries such as myself...We did not know if our paths would ever cross again. Seventeen years later, I received a telephone call. "Brother Ravi?" the man asked. Immediately I recognized Hien's voice, and he soon told me his story. Shortly after Vietnam fell, Hien was imprisoned on accusations of helping the Americans. His jailers tried to indoctrinate him against democratic ideals and the Christian faith. He was restricted to communist propaganda in French or Vietnamese, and the daily deluge of Marx and Engels began to take its toll. "Maybe," he thought, "I have been lied to. Maybe God does not exist. Maybe the West has deceived me." So, Hien determined that when he awakened the next day, he would not pray anymore or think of his faith.

The next morning, he was assigned the dreaded chore of cleaning the prison latrines. As he cleaned out a tin can overflowing with toilet paper, his eye caught what seemed to be English printed on one piece of paper. He hurriedly grabbed it, washed it, and after his roommates had retired that night, he retrieved the paper and read the words, "Romans, Chapter 8." Trembling, he began to read, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him...for I am convinced that nothing shall be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Hien wept. He knew His Bible, and knew that there was not a more relevant passage for one on the verge of surrender. He cried out to God, asking forgiveness, for this was to have been the first day that he would not pray...After finding the Scripture, Hien asked the commander if he could clean the latrines regularly, because he discovered that some official was using a Bible as toilet paper. Each day Hien picked up a portion of Scripture, cleaned it off, and added it to his collection of nightly reading...What his tormentors were using for refuse — the Scriptures — could not be more treasured to Hien." Lutherans are constantly reminding ourselves and others of Paul's words from Romans 1:16 which declare that the Gospel "is the power of God for salvation." So, in spite of our unworthiness, we are bold about speaking God's Law and God's Gospel. When you are reduced to having only that Gospel message in your life, you begin to see and understand more clearly what a precious jewel it really is. Hien Pham was finally released from prison and fled to Thailand. Today he is a businessperson in the United States, but, more importantly, he is a Christian whose only boast in life is Christ. God prepared him to be a living testimony to the transforming power of God's Word. That's what our Lord does for you too as you put your faith in Him alone so that you can, in all circumstances, love others as God in Christ loves you.

Prayer – Dear Lord Jesus, let our bold boasting in You alone prepare us to be useful in Your hands, especially for times such as these. Amen.

Are you interested in becoming a Stephen Minister?

Stephen Ministers are lay congregation members trained to provide one-to-one care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation.

Stephen Ministers come from all walks of life, but they all share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need. Trainees learn how to listen to, care for, and walk with those going through difficult times in life. After being matched with a person experiencing a life crisis, the Stephen Minister meets with that person on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support.

The caring relationship lasts as long as the need for care exists.

We are going to begin a new training session for Stephen Ministers in February of 2024.

The training is scheduled to take place on Sunday evenings from 6-8:30pm starting February 11th and ending June 23rd.

(We will take off for Easter Monday and Memorial Day).

"Be Imitators of Jesus"

God created man and announced His creation to be "very good" (Genesis 1:31), but, because of self-will and pride, Adam and Eve sinned, causing man to be separated from God. To bridge that separation, God rescued us with the greatest gift of all: His very own Son. In Christ, God speaks to us, reaches out to us with forgiveness, and receives us into fellowship. All we have has been freely given to us, not because of who we are or what we do, but because of Whose we are. Through faith, we see God's redemptive grace in Jesus, and we are motivated to live our lives for Him (Ephesians 2:8-10).

In Jesus, we see the attributes of God. In Hebrews 1:3-4 we read, "[The Son] is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of His nature, and He upholds the universe by the word of His power. After making purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name He has inherited is more excellent than theirs." God the Father has revealed the light of His glory in His Son, Jesus. As true man, Jesus lived the life of a perfect steward for the glory of His Heavenly Father. Just as Jesus put aside his own interests and desires— "Not as I will, but as You will"— (Matthew 26:39), we are called to be obedient through faith to God's ways rather than the ways of the world and our own natures. As God's stewards, we also receive joy and encouragement in knowing that we are obediently serving the Lord.

Jesus is always to be our preeminent model for our lives as stewards. We have a Savior Who lived the perfect life in our places. With an attitude of gratitude and joy in what God in Christ has done for us, we read and adopt the Apostle Paul's admonition, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:1). Through the working of the Holy Spirit, our goal is to "Put to death, therefore, what is earthly in you" (Colossians 3:5). By God's grace, we fix our eyes on Jesus, Who is the "founder and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2). To that end, we should saturate our minds with the truths in God's Word rather than the teachings of the world. "Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15).

It is entitled, "God's Provision in a Wilderness World" by Lindsay Hausch through Concordia Publishing House. In this Bible Study we will learn that for the Israelites wandering through the wilderness and us, God's manna is a gift wrapped in struggle. National Lutheran Schools Week is an annual celebration that promotes the important role of Lutheran schools in the United States and around the world. The theme for the 2023–2024 school year celebration is "Connected," inspired by John 15:5: "I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." The theme "Connected" emphasizes the importance of staying connected to God and to one another when we face challenges and difficulties and when we share in joys and triumphs!

It encourages Lutheran schools to continue to cultivate an environment of faith, love and fellowship, where students can learn, grow and thrive.

Whereas, "The branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine" (John 15:4); and

Whereas, All who believe and are baptized abide in Jesus and by Him "bear much fruit" (John 15:5); and

Whereas, Lutheran schools bear much fruit by teaching the Good News of Christ's death and resurrection for sinners; and

Whereas, Christ commanded His church, "to love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12),

Whereas, Every Christian repents daily, knowing that apart from Jesus we can do nothing (John 15:5); and

Whereas, Jesus told His church, "Abide in me, and I in you" (John 15:4); and

Whereas, Salvation by grace through faith because of Jesus comes through God's Word; and

Whereas, Through hearing God's Word each and every day, students and teachers in Lutheran schools abide in His love; and

Lutherans For Life Celebration Sunday January 14th, 2024

"Just As ... I AM" is the theme for our Sanctity of Human Life Sunday on Sunday January 14th, 2024 at Grace Lutheran. Our theme verse for this year is from Ephesians 2:10, "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

Charlotte Elliott wrote the familiar hymn "Just As I Am" in 1834. Born in 1789, a severe illness at age 32 left her unable to care for herself. Charlotte thereafter lived with her younger brother, Henry. The parish he pastored in the resort town of Brighton, England, decided to hold a bazaar. Its proceeds would fund a school building and scholarships for underprivileged children. Charlotte felt herself useless because she could not assist with preparations. This hymn's stanzas embodied her cries in answer to the despair. She then offered it as encouragement in a collection she called, "The Invalid's Hymnbook" (1836).

Just As I Am ... its beloved lines memorably testify to the sanctity of every human life. Almighty God does "receive, welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve" each member of our race with the heart of a Heavenly Father and the arms of a Gracious Savior. No ages, appearances, or abilities, no impairments or illnesses, not even guilt and grief can exclude from a place in His kingdom and a part in His family. We get to rejoice in our own lives and in our neighbors as gift and privilege. If our Lord's forgiving favor can overcome sinful failures, then His lavish love will more than make up for human limitations.

"Just" has become an especially precious word for Lutherans. Its verb "justify" occupies the heart of the Gospel. The Holy One Himself gives the reason for every existence by declaring humankind righteous for the sake of Jesus Christ. "Just" means "worthy," but it also means "barely." Any humanity from fertilization to final breath amounts to enough. God's creating work, redeeming labors, and calling activities never come up short. Persons undergoing surprise pregnancy, experiencing disability, or suffering terminal diagnosis matter as much as you and me. Indeed, they matter as much as the Son of Man, since Jesus incarnates all of our conditions and carries every sorrow. Even when human mouths cannot utter "I am," Lord God lends them His own likeness and proclaims, "I AM!" We Lutherans love life because He first loved all.
