As We Gather "Just As ... I AM"

"Just" can mean "barely." "Just" can mean "only." It implies "not enough to measure up." It captures and conveys the burdens we experience existing in a broken world. But "just" also carries a beloved joy for Christians. We have a just God. He justifies (forgives and saves) our hearts and lives, and He works justice (defense and vindication) for the victim and the vulnerable. In the same way, "I AM" sounds familiar and dear to us. "I AM" proclaims the intimate covenant name and identity of our Almighty Father. "I AM" expresses both the confession of our sinful insufficiency and the confidence in our Savior's promises. Our Lord is the God of life and living who brings presence and power. "Just as I AM" gives synonym for the image of God. Every human being, from fertilization to forever, has been made just as the I AM by His grace. We may receive each neighbor as much a gift and a privilege as the Most High Himself—no matter how their age, appearance, or ability seem to leave them "barely" or "only." St. Paul the Apostle's Epistle to the Ephesians clearly declares and explains this Gospel reality. This second chapter especially gives an answer to what makes human life of value. It invites us to think about living and dying in depth beyond how our culture and nature incline us to do. Above all, it lays bare the effects of both human guilt and heavenly grace, and it demonstrates whose activity matters most and where our race's energy comes from.

We celebrate the Lord's Supper

Members of our sister LC-MS congregations are invited to join us for communion. Guests to our Lutheran Church are invited to first speak with Pastor before joining at our Lord's Table. We hope you will learn more about us as we gather to "*Celebrate, Teach, and Confess*" the Good News of God's Grace! In the Bible, the Apostle Paul wrote: *Let a person examine himself and so eat of the bread, and drink of the cup (1 Cor. 11:28)*. Before attending the Lord's Supper, ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. Do I believe that I am a sinner, and am sorry for my sins? (Prov. 28:13; Rom. 3:23; 1 John 1:8-9)
- 2. Do I believe that Jesus Christ by His death, offers me forgiveness for all my sins? (Romans 5:8; Col. 2:13; Heb. 9:28; 1 John 1:7)
- 3. Do I believe that I receive the body and blood of Christ in, with, and under the bread and wine (not merely symbolically present?) (Matt. 26:26-28; 1 Cor. 10:16; 1 Cor. 11:24-25)
- 4. Do I desire to turn from my sinful ways and live a God pleasing life by the power of the Holy Spirit? (Isaiah 1:16; John 8:11; Rom. 6:12)

If you are unable to answer yes to these questions, please talk to the pastor before communing, as participating without a proper understanding of Holy Communion can be spiritual harmful (1 Cor. 11:27-29). If you can answer yes to these questions, then come with a repentant heart and join us in the reception of the Lord's Supper. Adults and children not yet instructed about Holy Communion are invited to come forward to receive a blessing.

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION PRACTICE—We are offering altar/rail communion as our communion practice. While you are at the altar, please let us know if you would like to receive the Common Cup. Individual communion cups are also available to you. You also have the option to kneel or remain standing during altar/rail communion. Gluten Free communion wafers are also available upon request. "Just As ... I AM"



"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:10)

Charlotte Elliott wrote the familiar hymn "Just As I Am" in 1834. Born in 1789, a severe illness at age 32 left her unable to care for herself. Charlotte thereafter lived with her younger brother, Henry.

The parish he pastored in the resort town of Brighton, England, decided to hold a bazaar. Its proceeds would fund a school building and scholarships for underprivileged children.

Charlotte felt herself useless because she could not assist with preparations.

This hymn's stanzas embodied her cries in answer to the despair. She then offered it as encouragement in a collection she called *The Invalid's Hymnbook* (1836).

Just As I Am ... its beloved lines memorably testify to the sanctity of every human life. Almighty God does "receive, welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve" each member of our race with the heart of a Heavenly Father and the arms of a Gracious Savior. No ages, appearances, or abilities, no impairments or illnesses, not even guilt and grief can exclude from a place in His kingdom and a part in His family. We get to rejoice in our own lives and in our neighbors as gift and privilege. If our Lord's forgiving favor can overcome sinful failures, then His lavish love will more than make up for human limitations.

"Just" has become an especially precious word for Lutherans. Its verb "justify" occupies the heart of the Gospel. The Holy One Himself gives the reason for every existence by declaring humankind righteous for the sake of Jesus Christ. "Just" means "worthy," but it also means "barely."

Any humanity from fertilization to final breath amounts to enough.

God's creating work, redeeming labors, and calling activities never come up short. Persons undergoing surprise pregnancy, experiencing disability, or suffering terminal diagnosis matter as much as you and me. Indeed, they matter as much as the Son of Man, since Jesus incarnates all of our conditions and carries every sorrow. Even when human mouths cannot utter "I am," Lord God lends them His own likeness and proclaims, "I AM!"

We Lutherans love life because He first loved all.
