# Pastor's Message

## "Holy Heartburn!"

Luke 24:29b-35, "So, [Jesus] went in to stay with them. 30 When He had reclined at the table with them, He took the bread and blessed it, and breaking it, He began giving it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight. 32 They said to one another, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?" 33 And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found gathered together the eleven and those who were with them, 34 saying, "The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon." 35 They began to relate their experiences on the road and how He was recognized by them in the breaking of the bread."

Our text from Luke 24 is where the Bible tells of these events after Jesus had walked to Emmaus with two of His followers on the evening of His resurrection. What a Bible study it must have been on that day! On the road to Emmaus, Jesus rooted those disciples in the firm promises of God's Word that had come to fruition in Him. Even more, Jesus set their hearts on fire by anchoring their faith in Him in all things (Luke 24:32). That's a fire, a holy heartburn, which comes from God's love and grace through faith in the Son of God. It comes from knowing that God's offer of life and salvation burns, but does not destroy. Instead, it empowers us and sets our lives on fire to make a difference, both now and in our eternity with Him.

People can be passionate for their jobs, hobbies, or families, etc. These can all be good, but they must never be the ultimate thing in our lives. Passion, even for the good things in life, must be rooted in and fed by the fire that comes through faith in Jesus. Then the fire of our Spirit-inspired passions, rooted and refreshed in God's Word and Sacraments, will not disappoint, deceive, or devour us. Instead, they will "burn" in us in a way that empowers our lives as Jesus' disciples and fuels our love for others in His Name.

Jesus speaks bluntly about the things that naturally burn in our corrupted, selfish, and sinful hearts. He says, "Out of the heart come evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, slanders. These are the things which defile the man" (Matthew 15:19-20). Even worse, such fires can blind us to the love that God has for us in Jesus. They can blind us to the wisdom of God's Word for our lives and for the lives of those we love. The passionate fires of sin and rebellion may seem fulfilling for a time, but those which go contrary to His Word only seek to disconnect us from Jesus and ultimately destroy life. If you have been singed by those fires, or if they are burning out of your control in your life today, hear the good news of this text. Even amidst the fires of hopelessness, ignorance, or unbelief, Jesus comes with the fires of His grace to open your heart to His forgiveness, life, and salvation, even delivering such gifts at the table of His Supper. The fire of God's Gospel promise in Christ burns brightly for you to help you battle the fires of sin and temptation in your life.

So, what makes your heart burn? When it's the Word of Scripture seeking to deepen your faith in your Savior Jesus Christ, that's a "holy heartburn," an empowering fire, not a devouring one. When life is continually resourced by the fires of God's Word, His in/with/under presence at the Table of the Lord, and the enduring promises of the waters of Baptism which offer grace through faith in Jesus, then you are receiving a heavenly heartburn that is sure to not only bless you, but to bless others through you. May those blessings be yours today in Christ, as it was for those who walked with Him so long ago and recognized Him in the "breaking of the bread."

Prayer: Dear Lord Jesus, open my eyes to see the empowering fire of Your Word as it creates and strengthens my faith in You. Then give me courage to "speak the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15) with the passion and humility that come from receiving the blessings of Your Word by grace through faith. Amen.

The Ladies Wednesday Morning Bible Study has started a new Bible Study on Wednesday mornings. It is entitled, "God's Provision in a Wilderness World" by Lindsay Hausch through Concordia Publishing House. In this Bible Study we will learn that for the Israelites wandering through the wilderness and us, God's manna is a gift wrapped in struggle. 
#### SUMMER WORSHIP SCHEDULE STARTS MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND

#### **Church & School Furnaces Needed**

We are currently in need of funding for our aged furnaces at both the school and church. This fundraiser is to replace the 7 remaining furnaces at our school and the boiler at our church. All units are over 20 years old. The goal is \$50,000. Please prayerfully consider donating above and beyond your general offerings. We actually saved \$1000 by purchasing the two furnaces together. Thank you!)



#### Being Available for Service

In every church, there are people who continually rise to the occasion to get the work done. Although God calls each of us to follow and serve Him, many of us are much more concerned about our own lives and goals than assisting in the Lord's work. If we focus on "I, me, mine, and myself," we take care of "number one" to the exclusion of helping and serving. In our prayers, we should be asking God to grant us hearts that we want to serve, and we should be asking Him, "what do You want to achieve through me today?"

## "Changing from Me to We"

By nature, we are self-serving, proud people. The world and our flesh promote the thought of "looking out for number one" at any cost. We want what is best for ourselves, often at the expense of others. We want to be in control, and we live as if we are invincible. To illustrate this idea, there is a story about Muhammad Ali who was the boxing champion of the world. He was on an airplane and was told by the stewardess to buckle his seat belt. Ali said, "I don't need to buckle my seat belt, because I am superman and superman doesn't need a seat belt." In response the stewardess said, "You may call yourself superman, but superman doesn't need an airplane."

We are probably not as obnoxious as Ali was reported to be on that airplane; however, don't we struggle with the same problem of our own self-importance? In our humanity, we place ourselves on a pedestal. Without God's presence in our lives, this attitude of self-importance will not change. By our own reason or strength, we can't change. Only through God's love and grace can we truly live with love toward others and with servant hearts. In Matthew 20:26 Jesus said, *"Whoever would be great among you must be your servant."* Jesus lived for His heavenly Father and others. Through God's Word and Sacraments, He changes us from being interested only in ourselves to seeing others as brothers and sisters in Christ. Through the Holy Spirit, God opens our eyes so we see the opportunities to reach out and serve others with His love. In Jesus' life, we see the life that He wants us to emulate. Jesus told His disciples, *"The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many"* (Matt 20:28). The entire life of Jesus was one of love and service. As Jesus came to serve, so must all of us joyfully accept a life of service to others. As we change from "me" people to "we" people, we begin to share God's love with others.

# **Grace Debt Reduction Campaign**

During our April Voters Meeting, President Tony Mirenda spoke about the \$28,000 matching fund challenge that we have before our congregation. As you may know, our congregation carried over debt from last year, and we are currently \$65,000 behind. However, our congregation has been blessed with generous givers who recently donated \$28,000 in undesignated memorial money to Grace. Our congregation's challenge is to raise up to \$28,000 to match the memorial money that was given to us.

We are asking our members to prayerfully consider giving beyond their firstfruits giving that they normally give to Grace on a weekly basis. We have already received \$1500 from some generous givers to help us begin to achieve this goal, and we would like to reach the goal of matching the \$28,000 by July 1st, 2024, when we begin the next fiscal year. We have a poster in the narthex to help us track our progress toward meeting this goal.
