Pastor's Message



"In Christ, We Are Never Alone!"

Matthew 28:16-20, (Jesus said,) 18 "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Our text for our devotion is from Matthew 28. What a power packed verse it is. It speaks to the enduring purpose of being God's people in this world for the sake of the world ("Go and make disciples of all nations.") And, it makes an incredible promise to believers as we go about being Christ's people for others, for our families, our friends, and literally to anyone whom God brings into our lives. It's that incredible promise that Jesus makes when He says, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Wow! Believers in Christ are never alone! In a world dying for real friendships, yearning for meaningful, enduring relationships, but more often drowning in heartbreaking loneliness, Jesus himself enters into the mix as our enduring friend, our ever-present Lord and Savior. We are never alone, even we when feel that kind of loneliness too.

Home Alone. Do you remember those movies? I really liked them when I was growing up, especially Home Alone 1 and Home Alone 2 – Lost in New York. The movie was about this little boy, Kevin McCallister, who always seems to get left behind when the family goes on a vacation. The family always makes it to the destination, and he somehow gets left behind, left to fend for himself on his own. But when you get right down to it, the point of the movies is that he's never really alone. In the midst of his ordeal, he still has the love of his family, even the family resources at his disposal. He puts all that to work to deal with whatever seems to come against him. Home alone....even then, when he was totally by himself, he wasn't really "home alone."

Sometimes I think that we Christians forget that, in Christ, we are never, ultimately alone. Sometimes we get this feeling that just because things aren't going the way we'd hope they would at the moment, that somehow God has left us to our own devices. That feeling might come because we've wandered from Him, gone our own way as if we could make it by ourselves.

Our lesson from Matthew 28 calls us to dismiss that erroneous notion, to repent of that notion completely. Even as human beings, in general, the Bible teaches that, we live, move, and have our very being because we are created in the image of God (Acts 17:28). Our rebellion, our sin, our willingness to go our own way would be like our Home Alone character trying to buy food without His dad's credit cards, with only the money in his pocket (not much), or to sleep in a house which he had to provide on his own terms as if he could, can you say, *"Homeless alone,"*... or to protect himself with only the wits and strength of a 10 year old in New York City or Chicago, yikes. If that were the case, the movies would have had a very different ending than they do. Thank God, in the movie, the young lad realized that through it all, in spite of his foolishness and childishness, he knew and was thankful for the love of his parents, their protection, their blessing.

Jesus gets even more personal with us today. No matter how things might be going in our lives at the moment, maybe you are without the resources of loving parents like our "*Home Alone*" star, or maybe you do feel "all by yourself" and truly, "on your own" yearning for more....Especially then, Jesus calls you to the exciting adventure of living life with Him, living it as His people for others. When you open His Word, you commune with Him. You receive His love, His forgiveness, His life and salvation. Faith in Him brings joy even amidst sadness, peace in the middle of trials. He locates Himself, through His Word and Sacraments, so that you and I can always find Him with His blessings to be received and His resources to be shared. Wow!

In view of all of that, Jesus, then makes this incredible promise to those who believe in Him....He himself will be with us always. You are never, ever alone when you are His people. Get it! This isn't the mushy ending of holiday movie, this is so much more....it is the reality that through it all, there is one who will never let you down, who will never leave you to your own devices, who will be there for you with His wisdom through the Bible, with His presence through the Word and Sacraments, with an empowering Holy Spirit that will encourage, comfort, and strengthen you to live boldly now and forever. Home alone....no, never alone, and always at Home with Jesus Christ who lived for me, lives with me, and even lives in me until He brings me home to heaven with Him face to face.

Prayer – Dear Lord Jesus, there are times when I do feel overwhelmed by the loneliness that seems to be plaguing our world at the moment. Give me courage to look especially then to you, through the gifts of your Word and Sacraments, so that I can not only deal with such things, but be empowered to live my life boldly through them. Help me realize that when you are with me, I'm never ever on my own. With your constant care, your loving presence, open me up, even then, to see the possibilities of friendships and caring camaraderie that you want for my life until I see you face to face in eternity. Amen.

Grace Debt Reduction Campaign


During our April Voters Meeting, President Tony Mirenda spoke about the \$28,000 matching fund challenge that we have before our congregation. As you may know, our congregation carried over debt from last year, and we are currently \$65,000 behind. However, our congregation has been blessed with generous givers who recently donated \$28,000 in undesignated memorial money to Grace. Our congregation's challenge is to raise up to \$28,000 to match the memorial money that was given to us.

We are asking our members to prayerfully consider giving beyond their firstfruits giving that they normally give to Grace on a weekly basis. We have already received \$4610 from some generous givers to help us begin to achieve this goal, and we would like to reach the goal of matching the \$28,000 by July 1st, 2024, when we begin the next fiscal year. We have a poster in the narthex to help us track our progress toward meeting this goal.

Thank you for your support of the ministries at Grace and please pray that we can meet our Debt Reduction Matching Challenge goal by July of this year!

Church & School Furnaces Needed

We are currently in need of funding for our aged furnaces at both the school and church. This fundraiser is to replace the 7 remaining furnaces at our school and the boiler at our church. All units are over 20 years old. The goal is \$50,000. Please prayerfully consider donating above and beyond your general offerings. There will be offering envelopes in the narthex and a donation box for your offerings. Thank you for your ongoing support of our ministries at Grace! God bless you! **Currently we have raised over\$27,886.63 for the church & school furnace fund, thank you for your support!** (In the month of December, we had to replace the twin furnaces to the school gym and 1st Grade classroom at a cost of about \$9,000, we couldn't have been able to replace these furnaces without your help and support from our furnace fund, which has been approved in our previous voter's meetings. We actually saved \$1000 by purchasing the two furnaces together. Thank you!)

"Becoming Rich"

Through the working of the Holy Spirit, Christians understand that riches do not consist of money. In fact, riches have nothing to do with money. We can have very little money and be very rich or be very wealthy and be impoverished. True riches have to do with a right relationship with Jesus Who brings us happiness, satisfaction, joy, love, and peace. Material possessions do not constitute real riches.

Material things are transitory. "When your eyes light on it, [wealth] is gone, for suddenly it sprouts wings, flying like an eagle toward heaven" (Proverbs 23:5). What we possess materially is subject to loss in a variety of ways. Our wealth can be lost in the stock market or through rust, obsolescence, and thievery. No matter how much money we may have, we have no way of guaranteeing that it can be kept safe and secure. Money can be lost, stolen, or its purchasing power lost through inflation. Investments can decline in value and businesses can fail. Our property can be burned or robbed. All material things can be gone quickly. Even if our material things stay with us, we will eventually leave them, because, at the end, we can take nothing with us.

Material goods and earthly treasures are deceitful and uncertain. In Jesus explanation of the Parable of the Sower, He said, "As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful" (Matthew 13:22). In the Apostle Paul's letter to Timothy, he wrote, "As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, Who richly provides us with everything to enjoy" (1 Timothy 6:17).

So, if we want to be rich, it cannot be on the basis of material things. Things of this world are much too precarious a foundation on which to build a life. With God's help, we can turn away from material things and turn toward Christ. Jesus urges us to *"lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven…For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also"* (Matthew 6:20-21). As God's people, our riches come from storing up riches in heaven.

Loving God with all of our heart, soul, and strength and our neighbors as ourselves builds up treasures in heaven. As the Holy Spirit leads us to loosen our grip on things of this world, we can learn to be content with what we have rather than always wanting more worldly things.

Through faith, we are rich. As Christians, we receive the riches of eternal life with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
