Pastor's Message



"Celebrating God's Love."

Luke 14:1-14, "One Sabbath, when [Jesus] went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully. And behold, there was a man before him who had dropsy. And Jesus responded to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath, or not?"

Then he took him and healed him and sent him away. And he said to them, "Which of you, having a son or an ox that has fallen into a well on a Sabbath day, will not immediately pull him out?" And they could not reply to these things. Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honor, saying to them, "When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honor, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, 'Give your place to this person,' and then you will begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher.' Then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted." He said also to the man who had invited him, "When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. You will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."

In the text from Luke 14, Jesus tries to open their eyes to see that the Sabbath is a time for saving life, not seeking to destroy it, for experiencing the love of God, not for practicing hatred. In Proverbs 25, we hear about practices of humility and honor in the presence of a king and in Luke 14, we see Jesus, the true King, at a dinner, reflecting on practices of humility and honor. In a sense, we see Jesus, Wisdom itself, recalling the wisdom of Proverbs. But, I wonder what it would be like to read this text with a different proverb in mind. Rather than Proverbs 25:2-10, I would like to read these verses in light of Proverbs 15:17.

Proverbs 15:17 reads, "Better a meal of vegetables where there is love than a fatted calf where there is hatred." In that proverb, we are encouraged to see how hatred can destroy even the most wonderful feast and how love can bless even the humblest meal. When you look at the gospel reading with that text in mind, you begin to see what Jesus is doing more clearly. Jesus is helping God's people see how their lives are filled with opportunities for showing and sharing in His love.

Luke tells us Jesus was invited to dine at an occasion of some importance. It was the house of a ruler of the Pharisees and it was the Sabbath. Unfortunately, this was an occasion when hatred tried to destroy a wonderful feast. Luke tells us, "They were watching Him carefully" (Luke 14:1). The Pharisees were turning this meal on the Sabbath into an occasion of entrapment.

Earlier, Jesus had a conflict with the Pharisees and teachers of the law (Luke 11:37-54). He contrasted their detailed fulfillment of rules and regulations of their own making with their neglect of the love of God. As Jesus departed from them, Luke tells us the scribes and the Pharisees were "lying in wait for Him, to catch Him in something He might say" (Luke 11:54).

It is now another sabbath and another dinner and they are still lying in wait. They are carefully watching Jesus. Although Luke tells us the scribes and the Pharisees are watching Jesus, He wants us to see something else. "Behold," Luke says, "there was a man before Him who had dropsy" (Luke 14:2). Whereas the Pharisees were watching Jesus to entrap Him, Jesus was seeing someone who needed to be freed. Rather than use this dinner as an occasion for hatred, Jesus sought to use it as an occasion for love. Jesus took the man "and healed him and sent him away" (Luke 14:4). It would have been wonderful if the man could have stayed. We would have then had a Sabbath meal turned into a celebration of the love of God. But Jesus still had work to do, to change these hearts which were looking for sin into hearts that could see and celebrate God's love.

The proverb teaches us that it is better to have a meal of vegetables with love than a fatted calf with hatred. But what is best of all is to have a feast with love. That is what Jesus tries to teach the Pharisees in this text. He tries to open their eyes to see that the Sabbath is a time for saving life, not seeking to destroy it, for experiencing the love of God, not for practicing hatred. Jesus will continue to teach this until they kill Him for it and then, when He dies on the cross to forgive all sin, the table will be opened to celebrate God's unfailing love.

In the closing parable, Jesus offers us just a glimpse of what the Kingdom of Heaven will be like. Jesus prophesies of a feast where "the poor, the crippled, the lame, [and] the blind" (Luke 14:13) are present. In His ministry of mercy, Jesus will open the Kingdom of Heaven to everyone who does not deserve it and to anyone who can never repay Him for the gift He gives. God's Kingdom comes by grace. God surprises us with the power of His love to bless any table.

When Luke's text is read in light of Proverbs 25:2-10, the question posed for us is, "What seat do you choose at the table?" When Luke's text is read in light of Proverbs 15:17, the question is, "What do you see at the table?" Jesus encourages us to look carefully, to watch and see. The Lord will surround you with moments for practicing mercy every day.

You are eating dinner with your family. Who do you see at the table? Is that your brother with whom you are still angry because, when your mother got sick, he was not around? Or do you see something different? Do you see an opportunity for love, an occasion to show mercy? You are standing out on the porch, listening to the sounds of a party inside. Your dad has come out to invite you in. Your brother has come home and your dad wants to celebrate. Who do you see at the table? Your father's younger son who took his inheritance early and squandered it all, a fool who has now come back to take even more from your dad and make him out to be an even greater fool. Or do you see your brother, a sinner in need of forgiveness, and this meal as an opportunity to show love? God's love has the power to transform any meal, no matter how tense and conflicted, into a celebration.

You come to the Lord's Table for Holy Communion and, as the minister brings you the chalice, you see your reflection in the silver. Who do you see? A proud member of this congregation? An upstanding parent of a model family? Or a sinner in need of forgiveness whose life is transformed by this meal of love?


Confirmation classes will begin **Monday, September 15**th at **6:30 p.m**. for Public School students. The Confirmation Classes will be taking place in the day school.


Tour the Holy Land in Eastertide of 2026!

"Giving Cheerfully"

In the Old Testament, the people knew what God expected them to give because He commanded the people to tithe, which required the people to give one-tenth of their harvest or produce (income) to the Lord. As New Covenant Christians, we have the freedom to decide what to give, but we are expected to give cheerfully. "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7).

Giving is not to be based strictly by the percentage we give to the Lord but by the largeness of our hearts toward God. God appreciates bighearted people who give their money to Him cheerfully. It's not always easy to give cheerfully, because we need to spend money on rent or mortgages, food, and clothing, and we would like to take some nice family vacations or drive newer cars, etc. It is tempting to scrimp on generosity or to give with a frown.

Our human spirit has been profoundly twisted by Adam's sin, and this present world is a hard place to live. There is only one way that we can rise above those circumstances to live a new life where generous and cheerful giving is the norm and not the exception. In order for us to do this, we must have a personal faith relationship with Jesus Christ and day after day tap into God's rich supply of life-changing grace. The only power that can consistently overcome the sin nature that still clings to each of us is the cross of Jesus Christ.

The Apostle Paul declared this Gospel truth in Galatians 2:20. He emphasized, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me." If we believe in Jesus as our Savior and Lord, then our sinful flesh has been nailed to the cross with Christ, and the self-absorbed and fearful human ego no longer has any right or power to direct how we as Christians live. We can take this truth and apply it to the way we give. Through faith, we are empowered to withstand our flesh and the world who wants us to spend more of our money on things of this world and to give less to God. When we place our trust in God, we can honor Him by giving cheerfully.

As new covenant Christians, we give under grace so we are free to decide in our hearts and minds how much to give. Cheerful givers experience giving as a privilege. Giving changes from a "got to" give to a "want to" give. Cheerful giving comes from new hearts that God through His Holy Spirit has changed. Giving is to be inspired and voluntary, not an obligation or only out of necessity or possible recognition. Giving is an outward expression based on an inner conviction. Through faith, we understand that we are God's instruments through whom He works to help people in need, to support His Church, and to extend His kingdom. May God find us willing and cheerful to use our time and money to do His work.


Everyday Stewards - The weekly themes are:

Some of us go through this journey of Grief, and feel so lost, and Stephen Ministry has books that you may like to read or give to someone who is in need of God's direction, during this very difficult time in their lives. These books are not to replace having a Stephen Minister, but an added help to get through this difficult time or if there is not a Stephen Minister in your area to help you.

These books are free. All you need to do is ask a Stephen Ministry Leader or Stephen Minister for the set. Grief is one of the most universal experiences we share as humans—and one of the most painful. Just as universal is the need for comfort and hope after losing a loved one. Receiving care during these times can make a profound difference for those who are grieving, and the <u>Journeying through Grief</u> books are one powerful way to offer someone that kind of support.

Here's what four people said about Journeying through Grief after someone sent them the books:

"By the time I was in my mid-50s, all my immediate family had passed away. I read the Journeying through Grief books long after those losses and was amazed by how helpful they were, even eight years later."

"When my husband died thirteen years ago, a friend sent me Journeying through Grief. Although I'm an atheist, I learned a lot about grief from the books and have been sending them to friends ever since."

"I'm a pastor who has walked with many families through loss. But nothing prepared me for my own grief when my daughter died. The Journeying through Grief books were such a blessing to me at that time, helping me process my feelings and experiences."

"Journeying through Grief helped me understand the emotions I felt after my wife passed away. I read the books with my two teenage daughters, talking with them after each chapter."

Encounters with grief vary from person to person, but reaching out with care and concern can transcend those differences, bringing us together in the deeply human experience of caring for one another.

Giving Journeying through Grief to those you know who are grieving, whatever their situation, shines a light into their darkness. The books let them know they're not alone and offer ongoing comfort and hope as they travel the road of grief.

Are you interested in becoming a Stephen Minister?

Stephen Ministers are lay congregation members trained to provide one-to-one care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation. Stephen Ministers come from all walks of life, but they all share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need.

Trainees learn how to listen to, care for, and walk with those going through difficult times in life. After being matched with a person experiencing a life crisis, the Stephen Minister meets with that person on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support. The caring relationship lasts as long as the need for care exists.

We are going to begin a new training session for Stephen Ministers in October of 2025. The training is scheduled to take place on Sunday evenings from 6-8:30pm starting October 5th. Introducing RaiseRight -- the new name for Scrip The same program and process, just a different name.

What is RaiseRight? It's a no-cost fundraiser that helps support the ministries at Grace. We purchase gift cards at a discounted rate and sell them at face value. Each merchant sets their own discount. The discount percentage is on the form.

How does it work? You complete an order form to purchase gift cards through a RaiseRight coordinator. Forms are on the table in the Narthex, in the church office or from a RaiseRight Coordinator. Return the completed form and payment to a RaiseRight Coordinator, who will be in the Narthex after each service or to the church office. You receive the face value of the cards you ordered. If the card you ordered is in our stock, you will receive it immediately. Otherwise, we will order the card and you will receive it the following week. The difference between the face amount and the discounted amount is used to support the ministries at Grace for our church, school and ECC.

An added benefit to parents of students at Grace School, ECC or Martin Luther High School You will receiver half of the discounted amount we receive toward the tuition you pay. If you do not have tuition to pay, you can indicate on the form to "Support a Student" and have half of the discount goes toward a student who needs help with their tuition. For example: You purchase a \$100 gift card for Woodman's. You pay \$100 and receive a \$100 gift card. We receive a 5 percent discount, so pay \$95 for the card. You will receive \$2.50 toward your tuition. The more cards you purchase, the more tuition credits you
