Pastor's Message

"Happy New World!"

In John 18:36 Jesus says, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews.

But my kingdom is not from the world."

Near the end of this month of November many Christian churches around the world will celebrate the reign of Jesus Christ with "Christ the King" Sunday. The last Sunday of the liturgical church year commemorates His rule every year, no matter what is happening at the moment. It reminds us that all things are moving ahead toward the final day when Christ will come again and judge the living and the dead. On Christ the King Sunday Christians who follow a liturgical calendar then enter into a new church year. In so doing, they join all believers in celebrating the fact that Christ's Kingdom is already now present in this world. His Kingdom is here in the midst of worldly kingdoms that are passing away. But it is a radically different Kingdom, one of undeserved forgiveness, salvation, and eternal life as a gift of God's grace. It's a comfort to know that God is always at work to preserve the world so that He might offer all people entrance into His eternal Kingdom by grace through faith in Christ alone. Happy New Church Year! But, even more so, we yearn for a happy *new world* in Christ, both now and forever.

During this time of waiting, one of the hardest things to deal with is the apparent delay in Jesus' return. What we know by faith, we don't yet see with our eyes. There is still the reality of sin and pain in this world. Often Christians are tempted to believe that Jesus came into this world merely to make this sinful world "just a little better." We are tempted to think that Jesus only wishes to give us a bit of grace so that we can change things ourselves or at least be empowered to endure them. Now it is true that trying to lead a moral and ethical life, and to serve our fellow human beings in Jesus' Name can make this world better. But the Bible teaches that Jesus came to give much more!

So, there's real tension in being Christ's people today. There's the tension of living in the world as it is, and, at the same time, living under His gracious reign already now because of what Christ has done for us all on the cross. It's the reality of His Kingdom in this world, for this world, but not of this world. Our living and reigning Jesus inaugurated that Kingdom His way, through the cross and empty tomb, so that all might receive it by grace, through faith, in Him alone.

Revelation 21 gives us a glimpse of His Kingdom in all of its future glory. St. John writes, "1 Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away....3 And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. 4 He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." 5 And he who was seated on the throne said, "Behold, I am making all things new."

Jesus alone will make "all things new!" The day is coming when what we know is true by faith, will be true by sight as well. But, in the meantime, God calls us to receive Christ's Kingdom by grace through faith. He calls us to spread His Kingdom, not by force (the way of this world), but by service (the way of His Kingdom).

Jesus clearly differentiates His Kingdom from all others. He teaches us to "give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's" (Matthew 22:21). But Scripture also teaches that Caesar's authority is given by God for God's purposes, and not Caesar's own (see Romans 13:1). Caesar's authority, Pilate's authority, and even the authority of our own politicians are real and intended by God to be beneficial, but they are not able to save. Instead, earthly authority is entrusted to them by God in order to preserve order in this sinful world so that the message of the Gospel, the message of the coming "new heaven and the new earth," can be proclaimed for all to hear, calling all "out of darkness into [Christ's] marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9).

May we never forget which Kingdom lasts forever. Yes, God now works through His Two Kingdoms. In one He aims to work through earthly authorities to bless and preserve; in the other, He saves, both for now and forever, in and through Jesus Christ. You can be a part of both His preserving and His saving work for others. You'll be glad that you did! Every "happy new year" here lasts only for the year. But "happy new world" will last forever!

Prayer: Dear Lord Jesus, amidst all the distractions of this world, please keep my heart and mind on Your Kingdom, the Kingdom that lasts. Amen.


Sunday Morning Bible Class from 9:15-10:15am in the School Library

- Provide additional information and discussion starters that help participants apply God's Word to their daily lives.



What is Advent?

The church divides the year into different seasons that emphasize the life of Christ and the life of the church. Beginning on Sunday, November 30, 2025, we will enter the season of the church year called Advent. Advent is the season of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas, and continuing to Epiphany January 6, 2026.

"All About Mary"

On Thursday nights @ 6:30pm at Grace during the month of December we will once again be having our Advent Midweek Worship Services. The Advent season starts the time that is referred to as the festival half of the Church Year. Between now and the final week of the Easter season, we will follow the life of our Lord Jesus Christ, from now, when we await His

coming as a baby in Bethlehem, to the time when He physically leaves the earth at His ascension and then His disciples begin the new era of life in the church as it takes form in Jerusalem and beyond.

During Advent, we wait *for* Jesus, *with* Jesus. The darkest part of the year is brightened by the assurance that the Savior who came for the world once is coming again. And we do not wait alone. Together, the whole Christian Church is accompanied in this waiting by the Christ who promises to be with His people always. Jesus' mother, the virgin Mary, knows a lot about waiting. With pregnant anticipation, Mary waited *for* Jesus, the promised Messiah who would reign from David's throne forever. But Mary was always waiting *with* Jesus, the Son of the Most High nestled within her womb. Throughout this Advent, we will listen with Mary, sing with Mary, and wait with Mary. Because, on darkest days, the Christ comes as near to you as He did to Mary to wait *with* you for the glorious sunrise that's coming.

Please note, due to our special holiday worship there will be no Thursday night worship service on Thursday December 25th, as we will be having worship that morning on Christmas Day.

How Stephen Ministry Works

The Stephen Minister steps in "AFTER" things in your life seem to go astray and you need someone to talk with that will walk with you through this time of need.



A free and **confidential** service, Stephen Ministry serves people who are struggling with a special need or going through a difficult time. They are paired with lay persons who have been trained as Stephen Ministers to offer Christian support and care. This is someone who is going to walk along beside you, is going to hold your hand the whole way. If you just want to sit there and cry, that's fine. If you want prayer, they will pray, but they're not going to come and hit you over the head with a Bible.

Stephen Ministry is helping people walk through a difficult time in their life and showing them Christian care. It is what the church is supposed to be.

The ministry itself works like this:

Pastors, church staff and lay leaders attend a one-week Leader Training Course, taught by the Stephen Ministries St. Louis facility to learn how to implement and direct the Stephen Series in their congregations. These trained Stephen Leaders then return home to set up and administer Stephen Ministry in their congregations.

Stephen Leaders recruit and select lay people from a congregation to serve as Stephen Ministers and provide them with 50 hours of Christian care giving training in the congregation, and as long as they are a Stephen Minister they get continued education at their monthly meetings.

Some of the training topics include **listening**, assertiveness, **confidentiality**, and ministering to people in specific situations such as childbirth, divorce, terminal illness, grief and much more. Stephen Ministers are also trained to recognize when a care receiver's needs go beyond the care a Stephen Minister can provide, and where and how to refer the care receiver for additional care.

A very key training module is what we call **process** versus **results**. We are there to perform a caring process--to listen and care-- not to try to "fix things" or push for results. We are the care givers; **GOD** is the cure giver.

After the Stephen Minister is commissioned, Stephen Leaders link them with a care receiver--a member of the congregation who is in need of quality Christian care.

Stephen Ministry is not just for people in our congregation but also it is a community outreach program. We sometimes get referrals from churches in other parts of the city or if someone moves we will find a Stephen Minister in their new town.

A Stephen Minister normally is assigned to only one care receiver at a time and meets with the care receiver for an average of about an hour each week. Stephen Ministers also meet once a month for peer supervision and continuing education.

Stephen Ministers are not counselors, they are trained **listeners** and caregivers. Those who stand to benefit most from Stephen Ministry are the care receivers. Having someone to talk to walk alongside, in **confidentiality**, during life's crises, both big and small, can make the journey a little smoother.

If you are going through an emotional or spiritual struggle, it's going to come out in a physical way. Stephen Ministry is here to help your physical being, spiritual and emotional being. Some folks are unsure about seeking care and wonder whether a strong person should need to ask for care. God sent us to help one another, Stephen Ministry is on way God provides that care.

Our Stephen Ministry at Grace has been going on since 2004 and has been growing!

"Called to Be Ambassadors"

In Webster's New World Dictionary, ambassador is defined as "the highest-ranking diplomatic representative of one country to another." An ambassador of the United States to another country holds a very prestigious position. This person speaks for our country. The honor of a country is in the ambassador's hands. The responsibility of an ambassador is to represent his/her country in a very honorable way.

By His grace, God calls us to be ambassadors for Jesus by representing and speaking on His behalf. We bring Jesus' message to the world. As important as it is to be an ambassador who represents a country, it is a much greater privilege and a much more significant responsibility to represent Jesus. The Apostle Paul wrote, "All this is from God, Who through Christ reconciled us to Himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation...Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making His appeal through us" (2 Corinthians 5:18-20). Just as Jesus sent Paul to be an ambassador, He is sending us. As ambassadors for Jesus, we share the Gospel with whomever God places in our paths.

God makes His appeal to unbelievers through us, and, therefore, it is imperative that we share the Gospel, which is the life-giving truth. We are to preach and teach the Word of God. We choose to be among those workers in the harvest field (Matthew 9:36-38) who share our testimonies of faith, always pointing others to Christ and His Gospel. In December of 2019 Thrivent started paying for the stamps, since then we have sent out more than 6,000 cards. A couple of years ago Gail Nowakowski and her daughter Michelle offered to make all the beautiful cards that you see on the table in the back of church. They donate their time and the money to purchase the items needed to make these beautiful cards.

A few years ago Kathy Kolb brought me a pattern for the prayer pads that we send out along with the cards. Lori Jablonski and Barb Huber started making those inspiring prayer pads which are so loved by those receiving them. We receive so many emails and cards of thanks. They continue to make them.

You can now order gift cards from Raise Right in the comfort of your home through your phone or computer. You receive the same tuition credit and it is more convenient! Many cards are available that are not on our order form because we cannot list them all.

There are three options. You can order physical cards, E-cards or reloadable cards.

Physical cards are mailed directly to you. There is a postage fee of \$1.00 for the first card and \$.50 per additional card. The convenience fee is 1% if using a debit card and 3% if using a credit card. E-cards appear immediately in your wallet in the Raise Right app. The convenience fee is the same as

Reloadable cards have a \$.29 reload fee per card. Some cards cannot be mailed directly to you and need to be sent to the coordinator, Gail Nowakowski. There may be a delay receiving those cards because we do not place orders every week

Simply download the Raise Right app and set up an account. The code for Grace is **6EA22B9E8287**. The current process has not changed and you can order Raise Right using the form and give it to one of the Raise Right coordinators in the Narthex after each service.
