Pastor's Message

"God With Us"

Matthew 1:21 and 23b, [where an angel of the Lord tells Joseph this about Mary:] She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins....they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us).

Who could refuse a peace that lasts because God Himself is with us? Well, many do. Why? Because as sinful, rebellious people by nature, we tend to settle for counterfeits, instead of the real thing. When offered an eternal peace that comes from sins forgiven, we would rather settle for peaceful circumstances, or just our temporal "peace of mind," right? We want the peace that comes with bills paid, relationships intact, body/health doing fine, and purposeful work to do for as long as we'd like to do it. Instead of "God with us" no matter the circumstances, we would rather just have circumstances to our own liking. Let the celebration of Christmas later this month, then, be a time of reflection when you think about what it means to have faith in the Savior who is "God with us" no matter the circumstances of the moment.

That's the offer that faced Joseph that first Christmas. He had so much on his mind. Mary was pregnant, but the child wasn't his. What would he do? How would he face the sneers of the people of his community? He had a bit of courage; he reasoned that he would try to protect Mary amidst his disappointment, "divorcing her quietly" (Matthew 1:19). But then things changed dramatically. Suddenly, an angel appears saying, "Do be afraid to take Mary as your wife" (Matthew 1:20). Why? Because God is at work in ways that you can't totally understand. Joseph could have run for the hills. But, thankfully, Joseph put His faith in God's Word and wouldn't settle for anything less than Mary as his wife, and Jesus as His Savior, no matter the personal cost of the moment.

Christmas and Easter are vital to us because they deliver what we really need. It's the reality of sins forgiven and eternal life secured. It's the promise of a peace that lasts, peace that endures no matter the present trouble. And that's what our Bible verses tell us today. They tell us about the peace that God brings when He comes into our world, when He promises to be with us in all circumstances in this world, and that in Him we will live forever in heaven.

It's the peace that comes when you know that there is one who is able, one who is capable, and one who is with you in all things to bring you blessing. Faith in Him says, "Nothing else, and surely nothing less." "O come, O come Emmanuel," come mightily into our daily lives. For when "God with us" is also God "for us," we can face whatever comes because our lives are secure in His hands. When we realize that in Christ we have more than enough, then life becomes a journey of "God with us" that experiences His abundant joy, eternal life, and a peace that lasts amidst whatever circumstances come our way. A blessed Christmas to you all later this month and we hope that you will join us for worship this holiday season!!!

Prayer: Dear Jesus, give us the wisdom and the faith of Joseph to take You at Your word, even when circumstances seem to the contrary. And give us a sense of what it means to live life with faith in the God who came into our lives to save us, "God with us" even now. Amen.


Sunday Morning Bible Class from 9:15-10:15am in the School Library

- Provide additional information and discussion starters that help participants apply God's Word to their daily lives.



What is Advent?

The church divides the year into different seasons that emphasize the life of Christ and the life of the church. Beginning on Sunday, November 30, 2025, we will enter the season of the church year called Advent. Advent is the season of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas, and continuing to Epiphany January 6, 2026.



Holiday Worship Schedule for 2025

On Thursday nights @ 6:30pm at Grace during the month of December we will once again be having our Advent Midweek Worship Services. The Advent season starts the time that is referred to as the festival half of the Church Year. Between now and the final week of the Easter season, we will follow the life of our Lord Jesus Christ, from now, when we await His

coming as a baby in Bethlehem, to the time when He physically leaves the earth at His ascension and then His disciples begin the new era of life in the church as it takes form in Jerusalem and beyond.

During Advent, we wait *for* Jesus, *with* Jesus. The darkest part of the year is brightened by the assurance that the Savior who came for the world once is coming again. And we do not wait alone. Together, the whole Christian Church is accompanied in this waiting by the Christ who promises to be with His people always. Jesus' mother, the virgin Mary, knows a lot about waiting. With pregnant anticipation, Mary waited *for* Jesus, the promised Messiah who would reign from David's throne forever. But Mary was always waiting *with* Jesus, the Son of the Most High nestled within her womb. Throughout this Advent, we will listen with Mary, sing with Mary, and wait with Mary. Because, on darkest days, the Christ comes as near to you as He did to Mary to wait *with* you for the glorious sunrise that's coming.



"His Ways Are Not Our Ways"

Here we are, ready to celebrate the birth of Christ later this month — a major event, even for those who don't believe in Him. Today this celebration is heralded back in October, or at least November, by merchants filling their shelves with enticing gifts, decorations, cards, and all the trappings of Christmas.

How different from the first Christmas! Mary and Joseph settled down in an inn. There were no photographers waiting outside to snap the first picture of the new king. No one knew what was happening! No one, that is, except for the parents and the host of Heaven who made the announcement. But to whom was this announcement made? To the powerful who would speed through the towns and villages, spreading the news? No, to shepherds who were outcasts, hired hands who were so low on the social scale that they weren't even allowed to give testimony in a court of law. They weren't even allowed to come into the Temple.

Yet these were the ones chosen by God to tell the good news. These wretched creatures saw the angels with "... the glory of the Lord [shining] around them ..." They heard the message the angels brought: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord ... You will find a baby ... lying in a manger" (Luke 2:9,10). They saw, they listened, and then they went to see for themselves. After receiving the Good News, they spread it. "When they had seen Him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them" (Luke 2:17-18).

If lowly shepherds could tell the story, can't we as well? "All who heard it were amazed," Luke writes, but he doesn't say all believed. All we're asked to do is tell the story. How could fear, uncertainty, or apathy hold us back? This is the biggest news mankind has ever received! As stewards of the Gospel, we have no choice but to follow the example of the shepherds and "spread the word concerning what has been told [us] about this child."

God wants all believers to be willing to tell others what He is doing in their lives. He exhorts us to proclaim the Gospel in our homes, neighborhoods, communities, and throughout the world.

You can now order gift cards from Raise Right in the comfort of your home through your phone or computer. You receive the same tuition credit and it is more convenient! Many cards are available that are not on our order form because we cannot list them all.

There are three options. You can order physical cards, E-cards or reloadable cards.

Physical cards are mailed directly to you. There is a postage fee of \$1.00 for the first card and \$.50 per additional card. The convenience fee is 1% if using a debit card and 3% if using a credit card. E-cards appear immediately in your wallet in the Raise Right app. The convenience fee is the same as physical cards, but there is no mailing fee.

Reloadable cards have a \$.29 reload fee per card. Some cards cannot be mailed directly to you and need to be sent to the coordinator, Gail Nowakowski. There may be a delay receiving those cards because we do not place orders every week

Simply download the Raise Right app and set up an account. The code for Grace is **6EA22B9E8287**. The current process has not changed and you can order Raise Right using the form and give it to one of the Raise Right coordinators in the Narthex after each service.
