

Oak Creek, WI, offers a range of school choices, including the **Oak Creek-Franklin Joint School District** for public schools, with elementary schools like Deerfield and Meadowview, and middle schools such as Oak Creek East and West. Additionally, there are numerous private school options.

### **Public schools**

## Other options:

### Local and State virtual options

- **OC Virtual:** An optional program within the Oak Creek-Franklin Joint School District for resident students who meet certain eligibility criteria and maintain a GPA.
- **Wisconsin Virtual Academy (WIVA):** A tuition-free, full-time online public school for students in grades 4K–12 across Wisconsin.
- **Wisconsin Connections Academy:** A tuition-free online public school for students in grades 4K–12 throughout Wisconsin.
- **Milwaukee Virtual School (MVS):** A full-time online program through Milwaukee Public Schools that serves students in Milwaukee County and surrounding counties.

### Other options

- **Other virtual charter schools:** Wisconsin has other virtual charter schools that are an option for residents. You can find more information on the [Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction website](#).
- **Homeschooling:** This is a different option from virtual charter schools, but it is available to families who wish to educate their children at home instead of enrolling them in a public or charter school.

Families may also consider private schools in neighboring districts, such as the South Milwaukee or Franklin School Districts, or apply to schools through the state's [Parental Choice Programs](#), which include options from various religious and non-religious institutions across Wisconsin.
