Pastor's Message

"A Much Disputed Passage"

Matthew 16: 13–23

Jesus said, "On this rock I will build My church," here in Matthew 16. Which rock? The Roman Catholic Church believes that the rock is Simon Peter and that the Church is built upon him and his direct successors, the popes of Rome; that the papacy has been established to represent Christ on earth, to speak for Christ, and to proclaim the truths given by God; and that the pope makes infallible utterances that must be accepted by the Christian people as revelations of God.

Protestant scholars do not agree with this interpretation. The Greek text plainly shows that Jesus did not intend to build the Church upon Peter and the papacy. Jesus said, You are *petros* [masculine form], and on this *petra* [feminine form] I will build My Church. Jesus here uses a play on words that cannot be reproduced in English with the same word, rock. However, it can be accurately illustrated with the word confession in this way: *"You are a confessionalist, and on this confession I will build My Church."*

What confession? The one Peter made: *"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."* This puts Christ Jesus in the center. On Him the Church is built. That is why Paul says to the Corinthian Christians: *"For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ"* (1 Corinthians 3: 11). Again, *"the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus Himself being the cornerstone"* (Ephesians 2: 19–20).

As long as the Church adheres to this truth and makes Christ its foundation, head, and founder, the gates of hell cannot prevail. That makes sense and is in full harmony with the rest of the Scripture. Even Simon Peter understood the words of Jesus to mean that the Church was built upon Christ, for he says in his Epistle, quoting Isaiah: *"Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in Him will not be put to shame"* (1 Peter 2: 6).

We still confess that the Church has no other head than Jesus Christ Himself. Matthew 16: 13–23 says, *"Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, He asked His disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."* And Jesus answered him, *"Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."*

Then He strictly charged the disciples to tell no one that He was the Christ. Jesus Foretells His Death and Resurrection From that time Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "Far be it from You, Lord! This shall never happen to You." But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a hindrance to Me. For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man."

What do you think of Christ? We can make no improvement on the answers given by Simon Peter or by Luther in his explanation of the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed in the Small Catechism: *"I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true."*

This Jesus, the head of the Church, gave His life as a ransom for all, and our response is to teach, preach, and believe. If anyone comes with any other doctrine or claim than this—that Jesus sacrificed Himself for us and shed His blood for our redemption—we must say, *"Get behind me, Satan, because such teachings do not come from God."*

Prayer: *Lord Jesus, founder and foundation of the New Testament Church, grant that we do not turn aside from this glorious and comforting truth that You are the head of the Church and have given us Your Gospel to lead us to Your eternal throne. Grant us the grace to abide in You and Your Word and to not turn away from that narrow way that leads to glory. Give us faithful pastors and loyal members who confess with us at all times that You are the Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, our Savior, our Friend, and our Lord. Amen.*

Rainforest Falls (June 15-19, in the mornings at our Lutheran School, VBS at Grace for 2026) This year's Vacation Bible School will use Group Publishing's "Rainforest Falls" program. Blessings for Faithful Obedience

Connected to Christ as branches to the vine, we are enabled to live obedient lives. Scripture makes some exciting promises to those who love and obey Him. Our Savior declared, *“I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing”* (John 15:5). The life we lead will depend on our relationship with Jesus.

When He lives within us, we receive His strength to serve and obey Him. When He abides in us, the love of the Lord will be seen through us. *“If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you”* (John 15:7). When Christ dwells within us, God will pour out His blessings upon us. Sometimes material blessings will be given along with the certainty of spiritual blessings. We will be blessed *“in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places”* (Ephesians 1:8).

The blessings of God are given to those who love and obey Him; the curse of God will be on those who are disobedient. Some of God’s blessings or curses, depending on obedience or disobedience, are recorded in Deuteronomy, chapter 28: *“If you faithfully obey the voice of the Lord your God, being careful to do all His commandments that I command you today, the Lord your God will set you high above all the nations of the earth. All these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, if you obey the voice of the Lord your God”* (Deuteronomy 28:1-2). The next twelve verses share God’s blessings to the obedient. Verse fifteen is the first of fifty-three verses relating to God’s curses for disobedience: *“But if you do not obey the voice of the Lord your God or be careful to do all His commandments and His statutes that I command you today, then all these curses shall come upon you and overtake you.”*

As we face decisions, we need to remember the far-reaching consequences our choices will have. We can choose curses by disobedience, or we can, by the power of the Holy Spirit, choose a blessed life by obedience. An old adage says, “We make decisions, and then our decisions turn around and make us.”

We live in a broken and rebellious generation. The obvious question, of course, is why? Many think the answer is confusing, but it is not. It is found throughout the record of Scripture; it is disobedience. How can we be obedient? We must learn, by the Spirit’s power working within us through Word and Sacrament, to be obedient to Christ in the details of daily life. We rely on Jesus’ words, *“My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness”* (2 Corinthians 12:9).

“Set Free: The Gospel in Exodus”

Join us for this exciting series as we meditate upon the Gospel, as it's so richly proclaimed to us from the Book of Exodus, as we begin the season of Lent, the forty days we set aside to focus on our Lord's Passion as we lead up to Easter. The Lord calls us to "Return to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning," and Joel calls for a "solemn assembly" (Joel 2:12, 15). Tour the Holy Land in Eastertide of 2026!

There is something special about meditating on the Scriptures in the very places where the events occurred. Pastor Aaron Koch of Mt. Zion Lutheran Church in Greenfield, LCMS, will be leading a tour back to the Holy Land next April. Destinations include Bethlehem, Nazareth, Capernaum, the Mount of Beatitudes, Mt. Carmel, Caesarea Philippi, Qumran, Masada, and of course the Temple Mount, Gethsemane, and the places of Jesus' trial, death, and resurrection in Jerusalem.

You can now order gift cards from Raise Right in the comfort of your home through your phone or computer. You receive the same tuition credit and it is more convenient! Many cards are available that are not on our order form because we cannot list them all.

There are three options. You can order physical cards, E-cards or reloadable cards.

Physical cards are mailed directly to you. There is a postage fee of \$1.00 for the first card and \$.50 per additional card. The convenience fee is 1% if using a debit card and 3% if using a credit card.

E-cards appear immediately in your wallet in the Raise Right app. The convenience fee is the same as physical cards, but there is no mailing fee.

Reloadable cards have a \$.29 reload fee per card. Some cards cannot be mailed directly to you and need to be sent to the coordinator, Gail Nowakowski. There may be a delay receiving those cards because we do not place orders every week

Simply download the Raise Right app and set up an account. The code for Grace is **6EA22B9E8287**. The current process has not changed and you can order Raise Right using the form and give it to one of the Raise Right coordinators in the Narthex after each service.
