As We Gather “Listen to Him!”

Although several hymns in *Lutheran Service Book* direct worshipers to listen to the Word of the Lord, only one hymn begins with that word. “*Listen, God Is Calling*” (LSB 833) has a unique history. It comes from the African nation of Kenya and was passed down orally through generations of singers until being written down early in the twentieth century. Originally in the Swahili language, it is a call-and-response that invites God’s people to listen to Him, as He is calling and “*through the Word inviting*.” In His interview with Pontius Pilate in the governor’s headquarters before His crucifixion, Jesus said plainly: “*I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to My voice*” (John 18:37). Our time of worship brings us many opportunities for careful listening for words of “*forgiveness, comfort, and joy*.” May we hear them thoughtfully and use them well!

We celebrate the Lord's Supper

Members of our sister LC-MS congregations are invited to join us for communion. Guests to our Lutheran Church are invited to first speak with Pastor before joining at our Lord's Table. We hope you will learn more about us as we gather to "Celebrate, Teach, and Confess" the Good News of God's Grace! In the Bible, the Apostle Paul wrote: *Let a person examine himself and so eat of the bread, and drink of the cup* (1 Cor. 11:28). Before attending the Lord's Supper, ask yourself the following questions:

1. *Do I believe that I am a sinner, and am sorry for my sins?* (Prov. 28:13; Rom. 3:23; 1 John 1:8-9)
2. *Do I believe that Jesus Christ by His death, offers me forgiveness for all my sins?* (Romans 5:8; Col. 2:13; Heb. 9:28; 1 John 1:7)
3. *Do I believe that I receive the body and blood of Christ in, with, and under the bread and wine (not merely symbolically present?)* (Matt. 26:26-28; 1 Cor. 10:16; 1 Cor. 11:24-25)
4. *Do I desire to turn from my sinful ways and live a God pleasing life by the power of the Holy Spirit?* (Isaiah 1:16; John 8:11; Rom. 6:12)

If you are unable to answer yes to these questions, please talk to the pastor before communing, as participating without a proper understanding of Holy Communion can be spiritual harmful (1 Cor. 11:27-29). If you can answer yes to these questions, then come with a repentant heart and join us in the reception of the Lord's Supper. Adults and children not yet instructed about Holy Communion are invited to come forward to receive a blessing.

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION PRACTICE—We are offering altar/rail communion as our communion practice. While you are at the altar, please let us know if you would like to receive the Common Cup. Individual communion cups are also available to you. You also have the option to kneel or remain standing during altar/rail communion. Gluten Free communion wafers are also available upon request. If it is physically difficult for you to commune at the altar rail, please speak to the Pastor or an elder about receiving communion in your pew.

FAREWELL TO ALLELUIA *Ecclesiastes 3:1-4, 7, alt.*

Pastor: This week, on Ash Wednesday, we begin our observance of Lent. To highlight the penitential nature of the season, it has been the custom in the church to suspend the

use of the word *alleluia*, which means “Praise the Lord.” The tradition not to use the joyful word *alleluia* in worship from the conclusion of worship on the final Sunday before Lent until the first service on Easter Sunday has been in place since the fifth century. The text of the hymn “Alleluia, Song of Gladness” (LSB 417) dates back to the 11th century and links us to a millennium of God’s people at worship. We will repeat Words from the book of Ecclesiastes, which remind us that there are appropriate times for all things, including a time to keep silence, which we will observe regarding use of the *alleluia* throughout Lent. For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die;

People:a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;

Pastor: a time to break down, and a time to build up;

People:a time to weep, and a time to laugh;

Pastor: a time to mourn, and a time to dance;

People:a time to keep silence, and a time to speak.

Pastor: As part of our observance of a holy Lent as it begins this week, we now say farewell to the *alleluia* until the time of our rejoicing anew at the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Day.


