Pastor's Message

"If Easter Were Not True" ***Matthew 28:1-10***

It is true, Christ rose. Two facts stand undeniable in the Easter message: on the third day the tomb was empty, and Jesus was seen alive. This is the crowning evidence of His Messiahship and His eternal Sonship. When Jesus was challenged by the opposition to perform one master miracle and give them one indisputable sign by which they were to know that He is God, Jesus said He would give them the sign of the prophet Jonah. Again Jesus challenged them: "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:19).

The sign of Jonah is fulfilled. As Jonah was in the belly of the fish and came forth alive after three days, so Jesus was in the tomb until the third day, and then He was seen alive. "See My hands and My feet, that it is I myself. Touch Me, and see. For a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have" (Luke 24:39).

Friend and foe alike say that He rose. The women, unsuspecting, came to anoint Jesus early on Sunday morning for His final entombment, to hear to their utter amazement, "He is not here, for He has risen, as He said. Come, see the place where He lay."

Matthew 28:1-10 says, "Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for He has risen, as He said. Come, see the place where He lay. Then go quickly and tell His disciples that He has risen from the dead, and behold, He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see Him. See, I have told you." So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell His disciples. And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of His feet and worshiped Him. Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell My brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me."

What difference does it make that Jesus rose? All the difference in the world! If He has not risen, then we are still unforgiven sinners, then we must face a condemning judgment, then heaven is closed forever to us, then we have no hope as we stand at open graves, then we are the most miserable creatures on the earth. Truly, it would have been better if we had never been born.

But the Easter victory brings to us life and heaven, joy and peace, certainty and security. Sin cannot condemn us, for we are justified by a faith that holds fast to the eternal truth that the blood of Jesus cleanses us from all our transgressions.

Death has lost its grip on us, and we can pass through its dark valley with Christ at our side. Death is man's greatest foe. Death stopped Alexander, stopped Caesar, stopped thousands of others, but death did not stop Jesus. He rose, He ascended, and He lives. Because He lives, we, too, will live. We will see God. In us is indestructible life by faith in Christ, the living Savior.

A new life is given us even now. We have been made alive together with Christ. We are reborn creatures by the power of the Holy Spirit. Forgiven, we are transformed into the children of light. Sinners by nature, we are saints by grace. We can resist evil. We have a new and hopeful outlook. We have protection. No one can take us from the Savior's hand.

We have a living hope. This expectation does not center around earthly, material things. All of these will fall from our trembling, feeble hands when death knocks at our door. It is certain that we will carry nothing out. But our redeemed and saved soul will see glory that no sorrow can lessen, no death can shorten. Easter makes heaven our home, where there shall be no more separation, no more crying, no more death.

Easter is the brightest spot on the horizon of life. Each year, we celebrate the greatest victory in history when we sing our Easter hallelujahs. We need not despair. We need not perish. We believers shall behold Christ in glory. And so shall we be forever with the Lord—all because He died and rose again.

Prayer: *Lord Jesus, risen and ever-living Savior, with all Your people we adore You as our Lord and God, who has conquered sin and death and redeemed all mankind. We praise You because of the glorious hope You bring to us. We need not weep desperate tears as we stand at the open graves of Your saints; we need not be afraid of the judgment to come as long as You are our living Redeemer. Take full possession of our hearts and make us Yours forever. Hallelujah! Amen.*

“Defining Christian Stewardship”



Brief descriptions or definitions of Christian stewardship are easy to find. There are so many books or resources on the topic of stewardship that they could fill several bookshelves. Each book or resource offers its own special definition. In addition, Lutherans, Methodists, Baptists, Catholics and so forth offer their unique definition of Christian stewardship.

The LCMS states the following: *“Christian stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God’s family, the Church, in managing all of life and life’s resources for God’s Purposes.”*

Books and resources on stewardship are helpful, but Christian stewardship is founded upon the Word of God. The Apostle Paul’s letter to Titus, chapter two, verses 11-14, gives a wonderful summary of the foundation for Christian stewardship.

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, Who gave Himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession who are zealous for good works.

In this text, God’s grace revealed through Jesus Christ empowers us to reject ungodliness and live self-controlled and upright lives. God’s grace makes our stewardship possible. Grace not only opens our hearts to receive the gift of faith leading to salvation. That same grace enables us to use our time, talents, and resources for God’s purposes. Grace turns our minds and hearts to Jesus, and we can live the lives that He wants us to live. Rather than live lives driven by worldly passions, He enables us to live transformed lives that are *“self-controlled, upright, and godly.”* In verse 14 of the passage above, Paul tells us that, since Christ has redeemed us from sin and its power, we are to have a zeal or passion to do good works. We are saved by grace through faith for good works.

From Paul’s letter to Titus, we understand that Christian stewardship begins with the grace of God. Everything we are and do is the result of God’s grace in Christ. Our stewardship impacts our relationship with God, with our neighbors, and with all of creation. May God help us use the resources that He has entrusted to us in such way that others come to know and trust in the Lord. God’s blessings on your stewardship journey!

The same program and process, just a different name.***

You can now order gift cards from Raise Right in the comfort of your home through your phone or computer. You receive the same tuition credit and it is more convenient! Many cards are available that are not on our order form because we cannot list them all.

There are three options. You can order physical cards, E-cards or reloadable cards. Physical cards are mailed directly to you. There is a postage fee of \$1.00 for the first card and \$.50 per additional card. The convenience fee is 1% if using a debit card and 3% if using a credit card. E-cards appear immediately in your wallet in the Raise Right app. The convenience fee is the same as physical cards, but there is no mailing fee.

Reloadable cards have a \$.29 reload fee per card. Some cards cannot be mailed directly to you and need to be sent to the coordinator, Gail Nowakowski. There may be a delay receiving those cards because we do not place orders every week

Simply download the Raise Right app and set up an account. The code for Grace is **6EA22B9E8287**. The current process has not changed and you can order Raise Right using the form and give it to one of the Raise Right coordinators in the Narthex after each service.
